A. Mohr, Surveyor; C. H. Hamilton, Commissioner; C. N. Burgess, Coroner. The sentiment for Statement No. 1 has in this primary election completely controlled the county. The candidates pledged Representatives, Carter, of Hood River, and Dods, of Dufur, have been nominated. Their success, however, is due to the fact that the Statement No. 1 vote was divided between four candidates indicating that measure. Their total vote aggregates fully 100 votes. The vote for the candidates receiving the nomination. Upon State Senator the issue was fairly drawn, N. J. Sinnott and H. L. Kuck being the only two candidates. This former, who changed his original declaration for Republican choice to Statement No. 1, carried the county over Kuck (pledged) by about 300 votes. The Democrats made no nomination for this office and it is understood that none will be made. This conclusion is confirmed by the fact that Judge A. S. Bennett and other prominent Democratic politicians were Sinnott's most active supporters at the primaries.

SLIGHT ADVANTAGE IN LAKE

Vote Close in Lakeview, but Cake Wins Outside.

LAKEVIEW, Or., April 18.—(Special.)—Indications are that Cake has carried Lake County by a close margin, also that Bailey and Campbell have good minorities. It is impossible to get accurate returns from many outlying precincts, as the ballot boxes were sealed after the count and no copies of returns made before sealing. The vote, however, was very tight in the county. Cake ran Fulton close in the town of Lakeview and carried some outside precincts. His vote is estimated at 200; Fulton's at 175. Other estimated returns are: Bailey, 250; Reid, 100; Campbell, 175; Carter, 100; Robertson, 50; Hawley, for Congress, and Bean, for Supreme Judge, received practically the entire vote cast. For District Attorney, Mills received about 200 votes, and Kuykendall 125. For Joint Senator, Merriman is estimated at 150; Holgate, 110; Willis, 100. Holgate carried Lakeview and Merriman the outlying precincts. Willis beat Merriman in Lakeview. For State Senator, received about 300; Belknap, 175; Marks, 40.
