## NAVAL SCANDAL SHOCKS GERMANY

High Officials in Imperial Shipyards Systematically Rob the Government.

## KAISER IS DUMBFOUNDED

Boast That Graft Does Not Exist in Fatherland Receives Body Blow. Millions Stolen by Government Employees.

BERLIN, June 13.—(Special.)—How many millions has the German government been swindled out of by the recently discovered embezzlement in the imperial shipyards at Kiel? No one dares even guess. How many of the vessels built and equipped in the yards are to be found to belong to the same class as the battleships built in Russia with wooden pegs instead of steel rivets? No one knows yet, and no one probably ever will.

The discovery that two high officials of the imperial shipyards, and possibly a number of others, have systematically been robbing the government for years has come as a terrible shock to the German people, who are proud of the proverbial honesty of their government officials, and who have always contended that while fraud might be found in America and Russia, all German government officers would always be found to come up to the Roosevelt standard, and be able to show a record as clean as a hound's tooth.

It is impossible to find out at this time how many officials are implicated or suspected; the government even refuses to let it become known how many people are under arrest besides the leaders, Heinrich and Frankenthal. The latter is a multi-millionaire, and it is some consolation to think that he will be able to make good the losses, though this will not heal the wounded German pride.

The Kaiser was informed of the affair just as he was about to prepare his speech for the opening of the Maritime Exposition here, and was so upset by the news that he found it almost impossible to entertain the King and Queen of Sweden, who were his guests at the time. He has given orders that the whole affair is to be sifted to the bottom, and that all the guilty ones are to be punished, no matter how high their standing.

Rumors to the effect that certain high officials in the Navy Department have received their share of the stolen funds, have so far been found to be unfounded, and are not generally believed.

## LIVES UNDER UMBRELLA

Eccentric Englishman Original Apostle of Simple Life.

LONDON, June 13.—(Special.)—A London newspaper man has just interviewed the original simple-lifer, an old ex-soldier, who for the last 20 years has lived in a wood 20 miles from London, with no other roof over his head than an umbrella. He found the old hero, who fought in many battles, seated under a large carriage umbrella, while close by was a baby carriage packed with miscellaneous goods, including several umbrellas, provisions, etc.

"I suppose you are an American," he asked, and added that nearly all the people who came to see him were American tourists, who had come to consider him one of the free sights of London.

"Twenty years ago I took to the woods," he said, "and I have never regretted it. During the great snowstorm some weeks ago I slept soundly, and when I woke up in the morning was covered with snow many inches deep. But I am never ill. I have not had a day of illness during my life. I have lived a simple, single life and I have no more worry than that tree has. I have no rent and taxes to pay and I have no wife to bother me and I have plenty of friends, mostly Americans, who have been to see me and who afterwards send me tea and tobacco.

"A man does not want much to live on, you know. I am quite happy under my old umbrella. I can sew as well as a tailor and I mend all my clothes. I have several changes of clothes in my auto. I have my bath in the woods and wash my things there. When darkness comes I put up my big umbrella, take off my boots, put my legs in a sack cover myself with my clothing, tie my perambulator to my arm or leg and settle down for the night. I would not change places with King Edward or your Mr. Rockefeller.

## TAKES TERRIBLE REVENGE

Trapeze Performer Allows Unfaithful Wife to Fall to Death.

VENICE, June 13.—(Special.)—A double tragedy recently took place in a traveling circus giving performances at the town of Mestre, a short distance from here. Among the performers were two acrobats, a man Rafaele and his wife, Emma. A rich man about town had fallen in love with the latter and had begun a liaison with her. Accidentally Rafaele discovered his wife's unfaithfulness and planned a terrible revenge.

While his wife was performing her dangerous acts in the flying trapeze under the roof of the circus tent, Rafaele suddenly cut the rope which held the trapeze and the young woman fell down into the sand of the arena, dying. Her lover rushed to her side, and while he was holding her head on his lap kneeling at her side, Rafaele clift his head from behind with an ax and then calmly surrendered to the police.

## Astor Bravely Climbing

LONDON, June 13.—(Special.)—Even his enemies must admit that W. W. Astor is a most energetic person and that if he does not reach the goal of his ambition of obtaining a baronetcy, it will be through no lack of effort on his part. His gift to the American war relics to the United Service Museum not having the desired effect, but rather disgusted the King, who is said to have called the act an unpatriotic snobbishness, Mr. Astor has now donated a new wing to the London Hospital for Sick Children, which will enable the institution to extend its work and do away with the overcrowding which has long been a great drawback.
