Cherries Are Hard to Move at Very Low Prices.

THOUGH CROP IS LIGHT

Canneries Are Small Buyers This Year and Prices Have Suffered.

Cherries are a drug on the market, although the crop is lighter this year than last. A year ago with big yields, cherries were selling briskly at 8 to 10 cents.

It is a poor year in most lines of fruit, as crops are large and the demand is less active than in former years.

The canning situation at Salem took on an interesting aspect for a time, but the excitement has now subsided.
