

REGULAR SERVICE FROM NEW YORK

American-Hawaiian Company Announces Regular Schedule From Portland.

NEBRASKAN IS FIRST SHIP

Local Merchants Will Receive Freight in Portland Between 25 and 30 Days From Date of Shipment From New York.

Representative Roberts of Cook & Co., Portland, and Kennedy, of the American-Hawaiian Steamship Company, has advised the transportation committee of the Chamber of Commerce that the line of steamers operating out of New York, via Tehauntepec, will make Portland a regular port of call. The first steamer will be the Nebraskan, which is not due to reach Portland until September 21. After that date there will be a 21-day service.

NEAR 50,000,000 BUSHELS

Board of Trade Secretary Reports Superb Prospect After Tour of Oregon, Washington and Idaho.

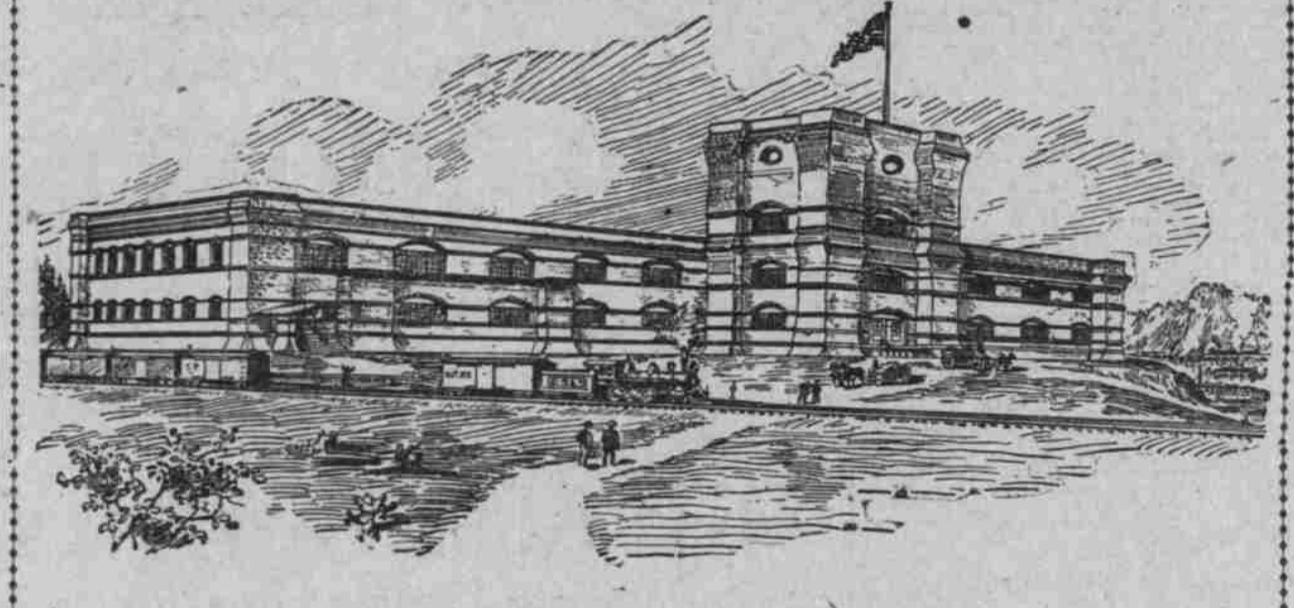
Secretary Fred Muller, of the Board of Trade, returned yesterday from a trip through the grain belt, where he paid particular attention to crop conditions. He believes the wheat crop in the three states will exceed the earlier estimates.

Around Colfax and Whitman County, the yield is much better than was anticipated. Between 35 and 40 bushels is considered a fair average yield per acre. Waverly reports a smaller yield than last year, estimating about 30 bushels to the acre. Around Moscow the average yield will be in the neighborhood of 30 to 35 bushels per acre for wheat. Oats have not been thrashed to a large extent as yet, and are estimated to run from 40 to 50 bushels to the acre.

Prices Not Alarming.

Taking all in all, conditions throughout the grain belt did not justify the fears felt at first that the wheat would run so much below the average as forces prior to a record-breaking level. It is in my personal opinion, based upon the information gathered on this trip, that the prices paid last week in the country are higher than conditions justify, yet they have had the effect of working up the farmer to an extent where he seems inclined to hold his grain rather than let it go very much below the figures paid last week.

GENERAL PLANS COMPLETED FOR MAIN FACTORY AT GORDON FALLS



WOOLEN MILL, AS IT WILL APPEAR COMPLETED.

The factory to be erected by the Gordon Falls Electric & Manufacturing Company, at the new town of Gordon Falls, will be 300x50 feet, with a wing 100 feet long. It has not yet been decided whether the structure will be built of cement or of stone. The building will accommodate machinery for a six set mill, but whether or not the full equipment will be installed at the outset has not yet been determined.

BRINGS SILK AND CHINESE.

VICTORIA, B. C., Aug. 15.—After escaping the disastrous typhoon at Hongkong by scarcely more than a day, and experiencing good weather throughout her voyage until her banks delayed her off Vancouver Island, the Empress of China reached port last night with 62 saloon passengers, 31 second-class and 34 Chinese steerage passengers, of whom 22 debarked at this port. The cargo included raw silk and silk goods valued at a million and a quarter dollars.

PULLED FROM AUTO AND BEATEN.

SEATTLE, Wash., Aug. 15.—Frank Spatlin, chauffeur for the Craden Macey Company, was brutally beaten early this morning by several men, in whom he had refused to give a ride. Spatlin was out on a lark in the auto, and near Lake Washington he was stopped by three men. They asked him for a ride, and when he refused, dragged him from the car, beat him into insensibility, and took the car. The machine was found later on Rainier boulevard, five miles away.

Captain Hobbs Heaves Anchor.

Captain Andrew Hobbs surveyor for the Bureau Veritas of the oceanic steamer mobile, Captain Hobbs docked the machine in front of the pilot's office yesterday afternoon. There was strong wind blowing and feeling that the machine might carry away the lines the master put out a patent anchor with one fathom of hump cable. It is reported that the Captain placed the fourth one was so close that the latter descended his post. Captain Hobbs recently returned from San Francisco and while in the Bay City was presented with the patent anchor which served him so well yesterday.

Steamship Allea Reaches Port.

With only a small quantity of freight for Portland, the steamship Allea, of the Portland & Asiatic Steamship Company, reached Portland late last night from Hongkong via Honolulu and San Francisco. The Allea sailed from the other side with a full cargo but the amount brought to Portland was small. All Eastern shipments were discharged at San Francisco. There is a full outward cargo awaiting the steamship.

Major McIndoo to Inspect Jetty.

Major McIndoo, United States Engineers, accompanied by Assistant Engineer Egan and other officials of the Government, will leave for Port Stevens this morning on the steamer Arago. It is the intention of Major McIndoo to make a thorough inspection of the works at the mouth of the river. The party will return the latter part of the week.

Coal Company Bankrupt
