MARSHFIELD, Or., Aug. 29.—(Special.)—The following is the full text of the resolutions passed by the Western Oregon Development Congress, held at Marshfield, August 25: State Retarded by Monopolies.

Roseburg and Coos Bay Highway. We favor the construction of a first-class highway, between Roseburg and Coos Bay, which may be adapted to the locality from Roseburg to Roseburg.
