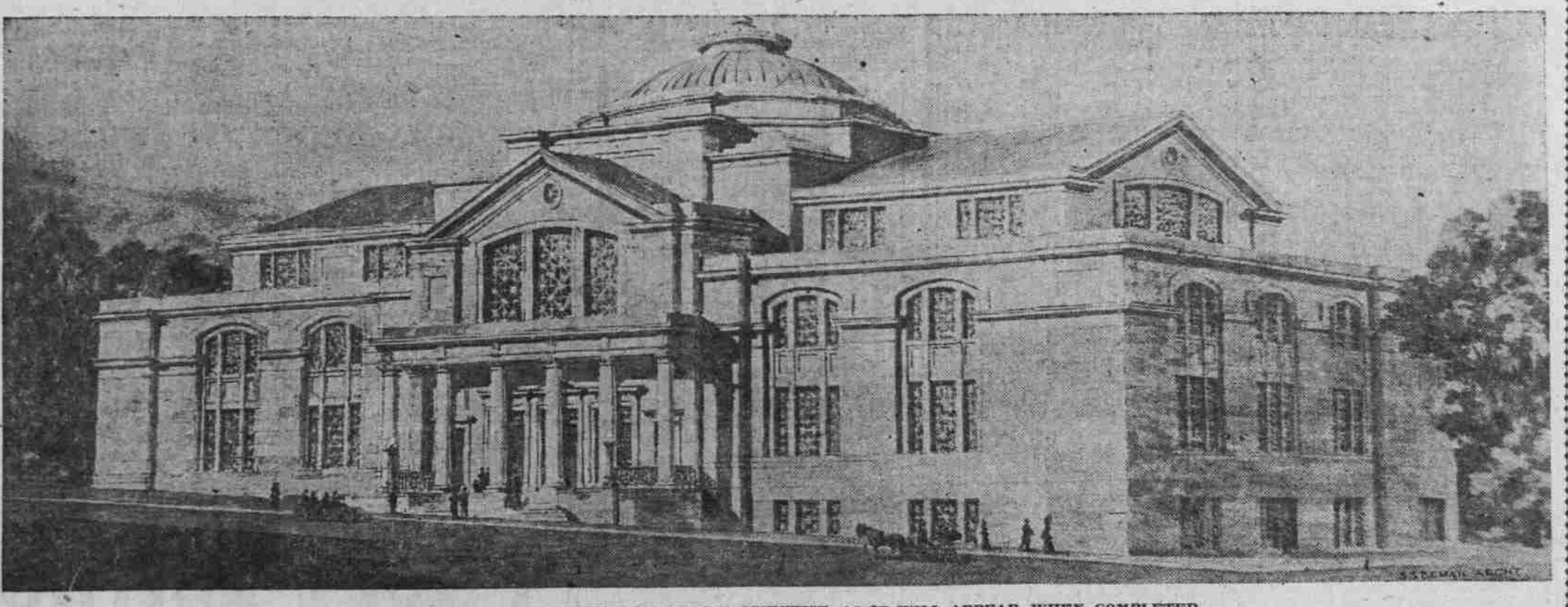

WORK IS BEGUN ON HANDSOME NEW CHURCH



TEMPLE OF FIRST CHURCH OF CHRIST, SCIENTIST, AS IT WILL APPEAR WHEN COMPLETED.

Work was begun last week on the excavation for the basement of the new First Church of Christ, Scientist, to be erected on the half block bounded by Everett, Eighteenth and Nineteenth streets. The present operations will be completed about October 1, when the foundations will immediately be put in. When completed the structure will be one of the most imposing in the city.

At the present time it is not known whether the building will be constructed of stone or of brick. This matter will not be determined until the foundations have been completed. The building committee has announced no date on which the building is to be completed, but it is presumed it will be some time during next Summer. The cost of the structure will be between \$30,000 and \$30,000.
