

STATE DEBTS NEED \$3,000,000 FUND

Next Legislature Will Be Asked to Make Many Large Appropriations.

SCHOOLS WANT BIG SUMS

Need More Room in Capitol.

At the State Capitol the departments are now crowded for room and when the Legislature meets it will be difficult to provide committee rooms. The only solution for this difficulty seems to be the purchase of a small tract adjoining the Capitol grounds where a separate heating station can be erected, with room therein for the state printing office.

There is a strong demand for the erection of an insurance department, a State Board of Control and for the enactment of a comprehensive water code with a provision for state administration.

PARIS, Nov. 14.—(Special.)—In France also the unemployed problem is coming to the front, though in a lesser degree than in some other countries.

Trustworthy statistics issued by the government department of labor have existed for the first time in France.
