

HUNTING OFTENS FATAL TO HUNTERS

Fifty Persons Accidentally Killed in Pursuit of Deer.

WIVES SHOT BY HUSBANDS

Number of Fatalities Shows Decrease Compared With Recent Years—Half Deaths Occur in Middle Western States.

CHICAGO, Nov. 28.—(Special).—The hunting season, which, for deer, closes Monday, has been much less deadly than of previous years.

The number of injured also shows a falling off, the number for 1908 being 67 against 71 in 1907 and 70 in 1906.

Over half the fatal accidents happened in the states of Illinois, Michigan, Minnesota and Wisconsin, the number in those states being seven, five, eight and eight respectively.

COURTS MAY CLASH

Oregon Decision Conflicts With One in Chicago.

FISHERMEN DEMAND PAY

Money of Bankrupt Booth Company in Philadelphia Claimed by Astoria Men, but Chicago Creditors Will Contest.

CHICAGO, Nov. 28.—Official court announcements regarding the affairs of A. Booth & Co. yesterday first spread joy and then sorrow among the creditors.

The jubilation was caused by a decree of Judge Kohlsaat directing the Central Trust Company to turn over to Receiver W. J. Chalmers \$25,000, which the Girard National Bank of Philadelphia had tied up in state court proceedings.

The \$24,000 claim in the Oregon court is principally for wages due fishermen. Attorneys for the Booths may contest the order on the ground that the receiver has prior rights and those employees will be treated the same as other creditors.

Judge Kohlsaat's decision was regarded as a big victory for the creditors. When the petition in bankruptcy was filed on September 10 the Booths had about \$50,000 on deposit in the Central Trust Company's Bank, and the Philadelphia bank garnished \$25,000 of it.
