ENTIRE SCHEME OF RULE IS CHANGED

Village Now to Be Unit for India's "Home Rule," and Viceroy Figure-head.

LONDON NOW PARAMOUNT

Local Parliament Will Sit in Two Cities and Deal With Minor Affairs—Will Have No Voice in Nation.

CALCUTTA, Jan. 8.—(Special.)—The administration reforms expounded by Lord Morley in the House of Lords have not evoked any frantic enthusiasm among the discontented Hindus. The small measure of home rule granted is thought to be entirely offset by the criminal procedure act recently adopted by the Governor-General in Council. The partition of Bengal—the disturbing feature—remains. Bengali opposition centers on the provisions against criminal societies. These are condemned as unnecessary and as giving facilities for molesting the innocent. Nevertheless, respected Indian leaders heartily approve the action against the Samitis, which are responsible for the excesses of the boycott and for training youthful anarchists. The general reception given to the measures in Bengal is quiet, largely owing to the knowledge that the original proposals were more drastic, including deportation.

Village the Unit.

In his recommendation of the village as the future unit for the whole superstructure of local government, Lord Morley has laid upon the Indian Government a task of such magnitude that it may be two years before the electorates are defined and organized. This uncertainty as to the very method of giving expression to the will of the people leads many of the wisest heads in Calcutta to hesitate before pronouncing an opinion on the proposals. But no far as the scheme for enlarging the councils and giving opportunities for popular criticism are concerned, the general feeling is that Lord Morley has been right in insisting on a substantial official majority in the Imperial Council, and reasonable, in dispensing with an official majority in the Provincial Councils. It is generally felt that the guarantee for the supremacy of British authority are adequate, while at the same time there is no impediment in the way of the capable native who commands the respect of his colleagues, nor any reason why he should not freely give expression to native opinion in the Imperial Council without favor or assistance from official centers.

Such a significant change in the numbers and composition of the Imperial Legislative Council must result in making it more of a parliament and less of a mere meeting than before. A clearly defined and possibly bitter opposition will be formed. It is unquestionable that the general result of the new proposals still further increases the direct power of the Secretary of State. The guarantees against non-official supremacy are designed to give effect to the decisions of the home government.

Change Government Scheme.

The absence of reference at this point to any discretion vested in the Indian government marks finally a change of policy which had long been formulating itself. The Viceroy and the Council in India are already shorn of much of their old authority, and must in future stand less as a source of power than as an instrument for carrying out the policy of Whitehall.

Strong efforts were made to avert the split which has resulted in the decision to hold two "National" Congresses, one at Madras and one at Nagpur. The failure of the negotiations, however, was almost inevitable. The Moderates took the view that the whole movement was an attempt on the part of the Extremists to swamp the Congress.

COMPLAIN OF PRISONS

Women Criminals in British Jails Not Properly Cared For.

LONDON, Jan. 9.—(Special.)—According to Elizabeth Sloan Chesson, British prisons for women are hotbeds for the propagation of vice instead of reform. She says that the experiences of the suffragists in Holloway Jail have drawn public attention to the needs of women prisoners. Every year some 8,000 women and girls pass through British prisons, many of them old "lifers" before they have passed their 30th year. During last year over 500 women received into local prisons had been convicted over 20 times. Four-fifths of the women prisoners of the country have served previous sentences of imprisonment.

The country goes to a vast expense to keep up a penal system, which is a complete failure. If the prevention of crime and the reform of the criminal are the main ideas, imprisonment under present conditions does not make for reform of the prisoner because prison industries for women are not educative in the sense that they teach anything that can help the prisoners in after life to make an honest living. There is no separation of young women offenders from older habitual criminals, no system of grading, no attempt to teach trades.

FIVE WARSHIPS IN YEAR

German Navy Launches Last of Group of Monsters.

BERLIN, Jan. 9.—(Special.)—The launch at Kiel the other day of the battleship Posen brings the measure of Germany's larger naval shipbuilding for the last year up to five vessels of the Dreadnaught type. The other vessels floated are the Nassau, the Westfalen and the Rheinland, battleships, and the Blücher, armored cruiser. The advancing of five ships of this type to the launching stage in the same 12 months is no mean achievement.
