GREATEST OF NAVY

Monster Battleship Delaware Takes to Her Element.

CROWDS CHEER LAUNCHING

Huge Fighter Will Be One of Most Powerful Vessels in Existence and Has Terrific Broad-side Fire.

NEWPORT NEWS, Va., Feb. 6.—The great battleship Delaware was successfully launched from the yards of her builders, the Newport News Shipbuilding and Drydock Company today.

MONSTER BATTLESHIP DELAWARE TAKES TO HER ELEMENT.

The Delaware will have a displacement on trial of 20,000 tons, or 2100 tons greater than the British Dreadnought and 750 tons greater than Great Britain's latest vessel of that type, the Vanguard.

The battleship was christened with champagne by Miss Anne Pennewell Cahill, of Bridgewater, Del., niece of the Governor, who had as her assistants the Misses Florence Hesse of Dover and Miss Ellen Coleman Dupont, of Wilmington.
