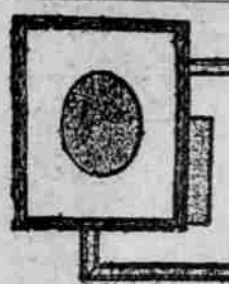

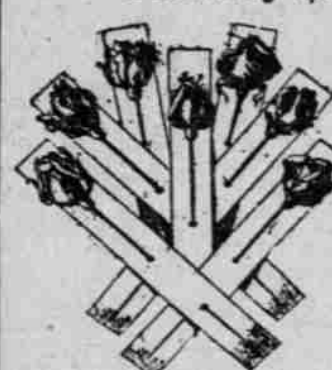

AIRSHIPS FOR WAR

Californians Offer Craft to Government for Tests.

OTHER TRIALS ARRANGED

Eastern Aeronauts Going to Nova Scotia, and Dumbough Will Try Flight Across Rocky Mountains.

LOS ANGELES, March 6.—The Aero Club of California, with headquarters in this city, has sent a letter to the new Secretary of War, in which the club volunteers its services to the War Department in conducting experiments with aeroplanes along the coast, with the idea of coast defense work.

Members of the club have the use of two balloons, the United States and the America, in charge of Captain A. E. Miller; Roy Knabenshue has a dirigible and an aeroplane; two members have completed the construction of full-sized aeroplanes, and nearly a score of others have completed machines or have machines under construction.

PLAN BIG AIRSHIP CONTESTS

Nova Scotia and Rocky Mountains to Be Scenes of Flight.

NEW YORK, March 6.—Dr. Alexander Graham Bell, president of the National Experiment Association, has notified Cortlandt Field Bishop, president of the Aero Club of America, to send representatives of the club to Nova Scotia, to make records of aeroplane flights that are to be attempted there by members of the association during the next ten days. Official notice has been received at the Aero Club that G. L. Dumbough, an aviator of Indianapolis, will start from Los Angeles Sunday, if the weather be favorable, to win the Lahm cup now held by Captain Charles DeForest Chandler, of the United States signal corps. It is his intention to find an easterly current at a high altitude and sail over the Rocky Mountains.

SAYS ART DEALERS CHEAT

Austrian Nobleman Denounces Italian Courts for Aiding Them.

ROME, March 6.—(Special.)—Count Andrássy, the Austrian nobleman, summoned a Florence dealer in antiquities before the Italian courts recently, alleging that the sale of a painting purporting to be the work of Raphael should be quashed, as the picture is a counterfeit. The court decided in the dealer's favor, because the picture was smuggled out of the city.

Andrássy, failing to get justice from the courts, has now denounced the dealer in the newspapers, stating he had been swindled out of \$50,000. The dealer's lawyers say only \$12,000 was paid for the painting and no warranty given with it, although documents to prove that Raphael had painted it were passed on the back of the picture. Those documents were shown to the judge on the hearing of the case, but he did not read them.

Thus it appears that, according to Italian law, a dealer is privileged to swindle a customer if the work of art is smuggled out of the country, even with the dealer's connivance and aid.

DESPONDENT, INHALES GAS

Wife of Wandering Invalid Commits Suicide at Bay City.

SAN FRANCISCO, March 6.—During a spell of despondency last night, Mrs. Louisa J. Jones, aged 38 years, the wife of Alexander Jones, of New York City, committed suicide by inhaling illuminating gas at her home in Gough street. Her dead body was found today. She left three young ones addressed to her attorney, E. W. E. Johnston, of New York.

LAWYER KNOWS NO CAUSE

Jones Is Traveling Invalid and Sent Wife Remittances.

NEW YORK, March 6.—Alexander Jones, husband of Mrs. Louisa Jones, is an invalid and travels extensively as had Mrs. Jones. When they were not traveling together, remittances to Mrs. Jones from her husband were made through E. W. E. Johnston, an attorney here. At Mr. Johnston's office today it was said that, while the firm had been advised of Mrs. Jones' death in San Francisco, they were unable to assign any reason for her act. Mr. Jones had been in Washington recently, it was said, but his present location is unknown. Mrs. Jones was a Connecticut woman.

CASTRO FORBIDDEN RETURN

Paris Hears Deposed President Will Go to Nicaragua Next.

PARIS, March 6.—Senator Jose Paul, the Venezuelan envoy to Europe, has left Paris for Berlin. He is authority for the statement that President Gomez has forbidden both Cipriano Castro and his wife to enter Venezuela. He is of the opinion that Castro will proceed from Europe to Nicaragua to consult with President Zelaya, of that country, hoping to get into touch with his partisans in Venezuela from Nicaragua.

Waterways Commission Organizes.

WASHINGTON, March 6.—The National Waterways Commission held its first meeting today. Senator Burton, of Ohio, was elected chairman and Senator Gallinger, of New Hampshire, vice-chairman.
