

# BAILEY PRESENTS THREAT OF TAFT

## Rumored Intent to Veto Census Bill Revives Talk of Co- ercing Congress.

### TAKES SHOT AT ROOSEVELT

#### Calls Civil Service System Hump- but Fails to Get Amendment Passed—Congressmen Lose Patronage.

WASHINGTON, April 10.—The bill to provide for the taking of the next census was passed by the Senate today in a form which, it is understood, will meet the views of the President regarding the appointments for census work under regulations by the Civil Service Commission. Efforts by some Senators led by Bailey to allow these appointments to be made upon recommendation of Senators and Representatives without examination received but slight support.

In a speech Bailey said it was reported that if the bill as passed did not provide for appointments under the civil service law, the President would veto it, and added that, if any such "threat" were made, it would stir up severe criticism of the President.

#### Civil Service Law Hump.

WASHINGTON, April 10.—Much to the disappointment of the promoters, Count Okuma and Mr. O'Han, a well-known business man of Japan, sufficient subscriptions have not been received to erect the proposed statue to Commodore Perry, which was to have been unveiled at Yokohama on July 1.

danger from fire, it is declared by the authorities, as the pumps at the Palestine station, located on the Macadam Road, have a capacity for furnishing 70,000,000 gallons a day. The daily average consumption of water on the West Side is 14,000,000 gallons a day, and even in summer not more than 15,000,000 gallons a day, according to Dr. H. Rafferty, chairman of the Board, so, as far as the supply is concerned, there is to be plenty. The only danger lies in the contamination, but this will be averted if the people boil it before drinking.

"It seems strange to me," said Mayor Lane, "that both pipes are broken. I cannot understand it, and in order to make an external mischief, there was or was not external mischief. I have ordered a thorough investigation by the police."

Mayor Lane said he is not very fearful of typhoid fever from the drinking supply at this time of the year, but he added that all who drink the Willamette River supply must first boil it, to make certain it is pure.

# MODERN POET DIES

## Algernon Charles Swinburne Passes Away at Home.

### MASTER OF POETIC FORM

#### Wrote Many Poems During His Life, but Was for Long Time Misun- derstood and Suffered Pop- ular Condemning.

LONDON, April 10.—Algernon Charles Swinburne, the poet and essayist, died this morning. He had been suffering with influenza, which developed into pneumonia.

Algernon Charles Swinburne was born in London, April 3, 1837, his father being Admiral Swinburne and his mother, Lady Henrietta, daughter of the third Earl of Ashburnham.
