PORTLAND JOINS IN RATE CONTEST

Suit Will Be Filed for Readjustment of Tariffs From All Coast Cities.

FUTURE TRADE AT STAKE

Proceeding Will Not Assail Spokane Decision, but Will Seek to Protect Markets From Eastern Invasion.

Papers are in course of preparation in Portland for an action to be commenced before the Interstate Commerce Commission in an effort to secure a re-adjustment of distributive rates from all coast cities to interior points.

In this proceeding it is likely that the interests of the entire Northwest will be joined and the matter presented by Portland attorneys in behalf of the Portland Chamber of Commerce and similar commercial bodies in Northwest cities, San Francisco and Los Angeles are also taking steps to join in the proceeding and several conferences have been held by those interested. The last of these conferences was in Portland last Monday. It is stated that a definite announcement of the plan of action will be made early this week.

The proceeding to be instituted before the Interstate Commerce Commission has its origin in the Spokane rate decision, the subsequent modification and the attempt of the traffic men of the railroads involved in those decisions to name a new schedule of rates applying from the Missouri River to all territory west of the river save the Pacific Coast.

Cities Will Act Together.

The transportation committee of the Portland Chamber of Commerce and the similar committees of other Pacific Coast cities look upon the railroad proposition as the most inimical to the Pacific Coast in the matter of rates of any similar movement ever attempted.

Antagonism toward Spokane or the Spokane decision is disclaimed; the Pacific Coast desiring principally a revision of rates that will protect its wholesalers and manufacturers from loss of the territory now covered by them to wholesalers and manufacturers of the East.

It is admitted that the decision of the Interstate Commerce Commission and the proposal of the railway companies are not in the rate now suggested antagonistic to Pacific Coast interests but simply open the way for a gradual extension of lower rates toward Chicago, St. Louis and other big centers that will ultimately deprive the Pacific Coast of the territory now recognized as tributary to it.

Not Aimed at Spokane.

NEW SERVICE BEGINS TODAY

Several Changes Made in North Bank Schedule.

The new passenger train service on the Spokane, Portland & Seattle Railway begins today with an additional local train between Portland and Clifton and a change of schedule for the Inland Empire Express, or Nos. 1 and 2.

The new local train leaves Portland at 4:15 P. M., arriving at Clifton at 5:30. Returning, the train leaves Clifton at 7:45 A. M. and reaches Portland at noon. The Inland Empire Express, which has been leaving Portland at 9:15 A. M., beginning today will leave a half hour earlier or at 8:45, and will arrive in Portland at 3:20 P. M. or ten minutes earlier than heretofore. No change is made in the schedule of the North Bank Limited. In connection with the new schedule a new time card also goes into effect on the Lyle-Goldendale branch. The Goldendale train will connect closely with the new local from Portland on the main line, leaving Lyle at 7:40 P. M. or 70 minutes earlier than heretofore, and reaching Goldendale at 10:20 P. M., instead of at 11:20. Returning the train will leave Goldendale at 3:20 P. M. and arrive at Lyle at 5:30, giving passengers for Portland an opportunity to take the Express for this city at 5:45.

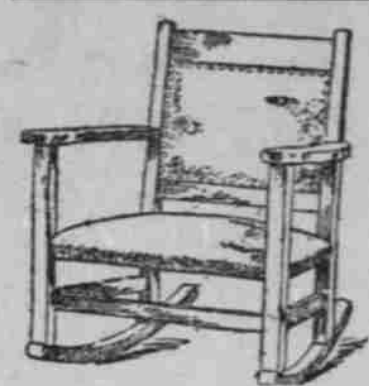

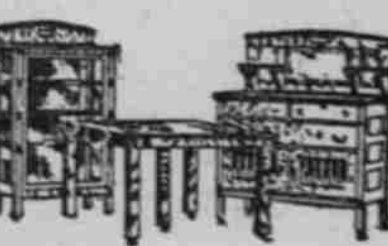

DEBTOR IS OUT OF JAIL

COURT RELEASES MAN HELD UNDER ANCIENT LAW.

Writ of Habeas Corpus Frees G. H. Irwin, Imprisoned on George Metzgar's Complaint.

George H. Irwin, after being held in the County Jail for a week under one of the ancient statutes providing for imprisonment for debt, secured his release on a writ of habeas corpus, in Circuit Judge Gatens Court, yesterday afternoon. Final hearing in the matter will be held next Saturday at which time it will be determined whether or not Irwin can be held further for neglecting and failing to pay his bills.

Embarrassment was alleged in the complaint against Irwin, wherein the recovery of \$218 was sought by George Metzgar. Judgment for the full amount was given some time ago by the court and an execution was levied against property held by Irwin. Satisfaction was not secured on the judgment and Metzgar, taking advantage of a statute of the vintage of 1864, demanded and secured Irwin's arrest and imprisonment as a judgment debtor. Through John Manning, his attorney, Irwin made application for a writ of habeas corpus. Issuance of a writ was

Then in Vindictiveness He Has Her Arrested and Gets Scolding From Judge for Trouble.

At his interference in taking hold of her and attempting to force her to drop the wood, Mrs. Catheron seized a stick and struck Hawley on the arm with it.
