END OF CASE NEAR

Predicted Hanley Trial Will Close Tomorrow.

OPENING ARGUMENTS MADE

United States Attorney Wyatt Bitterly Arraigns Rancher, While C. E. S. Wood, for Defense, Says No Evidence of Guilt Found.

Before the close of the afternoon of Decoration Day it is predicted the Hanley fencing case will be in the hands of the jury. This forecast is based on the completion of the arguments of United States Attorney Wyatt, for the Government, and Attorney C. E. S. Wood, for the defendant, yesterday. Attorney John M. Geary, for the accused, and United States Attorney McCourt, for the United States, it is believed, will not occupy more time than their associates in pleading for and against Hanley, making it possible for the jury to be charged late Monday afternoon.

Opening the argument for the Government yesterday morning, Mr. Wyatt reviewed the entire case, saying the trial, which thus far has endured for six days, made it clear that the Hanley County rancher was guilty of fencing Government land illegally. He asserted the evidence adduced throughout the trial left nothing for the jury to do but convict the accused rancher.

Attorney C. E. S. Wood in his appeal for the freedom of Hanley was just as vehement in declaring there was not a whit of evidence against his client, and that the prosecution had in no way connected Hanley with illegal fencing, as set forth in the indictment. He pointed to Hanley as a friend of settlers, asserting the whole range was open to the public ever since Hanley took charge of the property. Mr. Wood referred to the frankness of his client on the stand in his own behalf last Friday, drawing the jury's attention to the accused man's statement, "I never fenced a foot of Government land in my life."

At the conclusion of the argument adjournment was taken until 2 o'clock tomorrow afternoon.

LABORER SUES FOR \$25,000

D. J. Warren Charges Oregon Lumber Company With Carelessness.

Taking oath that he completely lost his sense of smell, that his hearing was impaired and a shoulder blade broken by a fall sustained while he was employed as a laborer by the Oregon Lumber Company in Columbia County, D. J. Warren yesterday filed suit against that concern for \$25,000 damages in the Federal Court. The complaint asserts the accident occurred February 6, 1908, and was the result of a poorly-constructed frame and trestle around which the laborer was required to work. The complainant sets forth he was sent by the superintendent of the lumber company over the trestle to get a number of tools, and that the

rickety structure gave way under his weight, precipitating him to the ground. Warren asserts that at the time of the accident he was earning \$2.25 a day and that his injuries forced him to lose wages amounting to \$115. He asks that this loss be added to the damages sought, as well as the costs of the litigation. The plaintiff is 45 years old and the father of six children.

Postoffice to Observe Holiday.

Decorations day tomorrow will be observed by the Postoffice. Postmaster Young announced yesterday that all departments of the office will be closed at 10 o'clock in the morning, and that only two deliveries of mail will be made, both in the business district. The money order window will be closed all day, but the stamp, registry and general delivery windows will open as usual in the morning, closing at 10 o'clock.

GERMAN LABORER SUICIDE

Herman Groeffter Hangs Himself When Despondent.

Making a noose of his suspenders, Herman Groeffter, a German 30 years old, hanged himself to a post of his bed in a room at the California House, at 304 Third street, about 6 o'clock yesterday morning. Little is known of Groeffter, but it is thought he was a laborer and ended his life in a fit of despondency over his inability to get work here after his arrival about a month ago from Fresno, Cal. The body was taken to the morgue.
