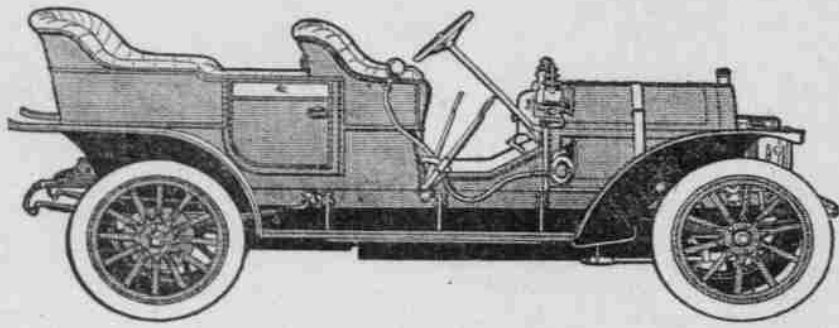

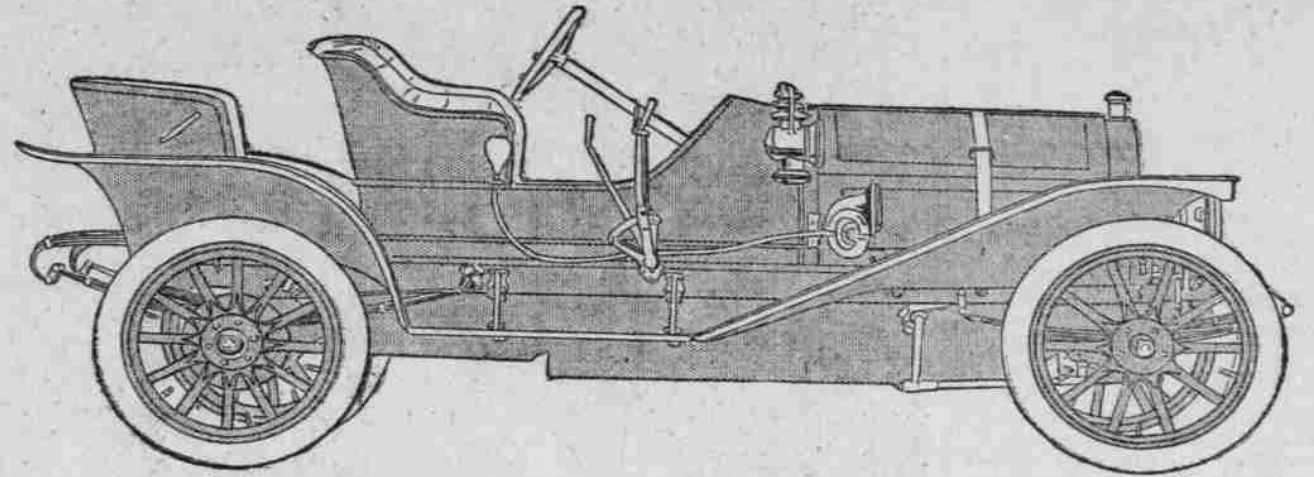

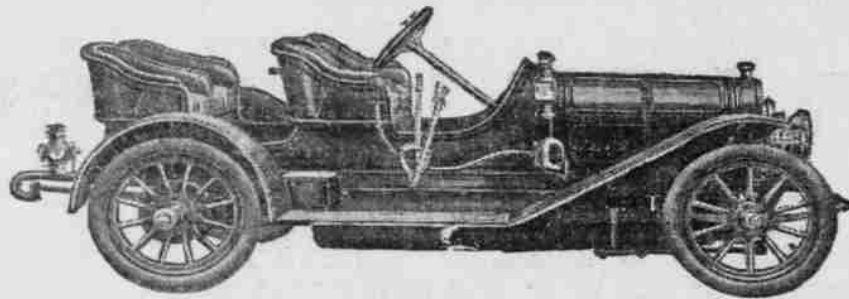
Annual Rose Festival Road Race in Free-for-All Class
