PORTLAND, July 24.—Maximum temperature, 79 degrees; minimum, 54 degrees. River reading at 8 A. M., 11.6 feet; change in last 24 hours, .05 foot fall. Total rainfall last 15 days, 1.93 in. Total rainfall since September 1, 1908, 23.18; normal rainfall since September 1, 1908, 44.11 inches. Deficiency, 20.93 inches. Total sunshine July 23, 15 hours 8 minutes; possible sunshine, 15 hours 6 minutes. Barometer (reduced to sea level), at 9 P. M., 30.06 inches.

WEATHER CONDITIONS.

The barometer has fallen over the North Pacific States, and cloudiness has increased in western Washington and western Oregon, while along the immediate coast in Washington a few light showers have occurred. The changes in temperature have not been marked, except in southern Oregon, where it is ten degrees cooler than yesterday. The indications are for showers Sunday in western Oregon, Washington and northern Idaho. It will be cooler in eastern Oregon and in northern and southwestern Idaho.
