Sight Test



Do the lines above look equally black or are some darker than others? If they look equally black you have no Astigmatism. If, however, some appear darker, the trouble is your eyes. To prove this, for instance, if the upper square looks very bright and the lower one is lighter, turn the paper half around and you will find that the square which was at the bottom is now very black and the former dark one is of a lighter shade.
