

4 DANGER OF TARIFF LIES IN PROSPERITY

A. S. Ochs, New York Editor, Discusses Timely Topics on Visit Here.

OUT OF DEBT TO EUROPE

Trade Balance, He Says, Is Exhausted, and Grave Dangers Lie in Trade Relations Till People Become Enough Educated.

A. S. Ochs, proprietor of the New York Times, one of the greatest and most progressive edited newspapers in the United States, declared at the Portland Hotel last night that the adoption of the new tariff bill has raised a financial problem fraught with grave dangers to the monetary stability of the world on account of its intimate bearing on European trade relations with this country, and the fact that America no longer owes cash balances in Europe.

Out of Debt to Europe.

"The United States at present is out of debt to Europe. Where for the past 20 years we have been heavily in debt to Europe, whose financiers loaned us money on our securities and such things, and in turn accepted our products, paying for them out of the cash balance against us, today there is no such balance. We are out of debt. This condition of affairs was revealed in the recent panic, when the problem presented stands something like this:

"Our big corporations, like the Pennsylvania Railroad, demanded such heavy amounts of money in carrying out improvements that they drained Europe of its gold deposits, so we had no balance there to offset the cash sent to America. Usually Europe became alarmed and was unable to meet demands for cash payments, and if Secretary Cortelyou and the City of New York had not come to the rescue with short-term notes, the Bank of England would have been wrecked—it is not generally known how close it came to going under.

Something May Happen.

"I am no prophet and cannot venture to say what will happen, but it is the fear of financial disaster that something will happen before the people can become properly educated up to the very important matter of trade balances. This will not come until we are out of debt to Europe, which has no other recourse than to pay for them in her own products—only to run up against the stone wall of our tariff which bars these products out of the country.
