Newspaper Man Spends Three Years in Building Home.

HE MAKES OWN FURNITURE

W. E. Bates Completes Two-Story Eight-Room House at Beauvoir by Working After Hours.

Big Saving Results.

Devoting the last three years in building a home, even the furniture of which is a result of his handwork, W. E. Bates, market editor of The Evening Telegram, has undoubtedly a modern Herakleus, who, in every work that he began he did it with all his heart and prospered.

Three years ago last May day, Mr. Bates, prompted by the pleadings of his brave little wife, bought two lots in Beauvoir, and, paying the first installment, the family, consisting of father, mother and children, moved into a cottage across the street from the home site.

His work in watching, reporting and editing the news was not interrupted by the arrival of a little son, abandoned the cottage across the street to occupy the incompleting, but "their own" home.

Another of the big features is Robbelle, the Mexican wire wizard. The most difficult feat ever performed by a wire traveler in America in the past is too trivial for Robbelle to bother with. Unflinchingly for three years Mr. Bates continued his task, not enjoying one day of rest from the time the foundation of the home was laid until the close of last month, when the work of construction was pronounced sufficiently complete to warrant a few hours of surcease now and then.

But at no time in the last three years has Mr. Bates been idle, for when his self-built home was roofed in, he decorated and at times when his bones ached, he devoted his time to the manufacture of furniture.

Complete, the Bates home stands one block east of Hollman Station on the Woodstock line on a site that makes Beauvoir worthy of its name. The home commands a magnificent view of the heights, mountains and city, and every detail of the building and the improvement of the grounds surrounding it makes it one of the most slightly homes of the suburb. The house occupies 40 by 54 feet from the exterior an adequate estimate of its size cannot be made.

THAT the true Nimrod may know where the big trout grow," is the stated object of a novel plan devised by Klamath Falls anglers for advertising the fishing facilities of the Klamath Lake region.

J. M. Scott, assistant general passenger agent of the O. R. & N., who took the part of one of the cogwheels in the scheme, has received a report showing that the plan is working out and the desired result is being attained.

On a clock on March 25, 1909, B. F. Marquis, of Omaha, and B. O. Snider and Dr. R. R. Hamilton, of Klamath Falls, started from Lake Side Inn, situated on the Klamath River at Klamath Falls and whipped the river for a distance of three-fourths mile with ordinary fishing tackle, and after five hours' angling returned to the hotel with a string of 19 trout, the largest weighing 103 1/2 pounds. The weight of the largest trout was 8 1/2 pounds.
