BANKS LOSE SOME CASH

Slight Decrease in New York, Despite Gains From Interior.

NEW YORK, Aug. 28.—The Financier will say tomorrow:

The statement of the clearing-houses banks of the City of New York for the week ending August 28 showed an increase of \$1,851,000 in loans, a decrease of \$1,771,100 in cash, a slight decrease of \$50,400 in deposits and an increase of \$50,900 in circulation.
