Gaiety at Coast Resorts Begins to Wane, Herald-
Season's Close.

LONG BEACH, Wash., Aug. 28.—(Special.)—With the first autumnal days this popular summer resort is beginning to assume an air of desolation and inactivity. Most of the cottagers have returned to Portland, and the last trip of the Potter, on September 6, will witness a general exodus from the beach, although there are still many excursionists arriving to spend early September at this unsurpassed resort.
