Mitchell Condemns Contempt Action

in Labor Day Manifesto.

NEW YORK, Sept. 4.-John Mitchell, vice-president of the American Federation of Labor and representing President Samuel Gompers in the latter's absence, has issued the annual Labor day manifesto to the workers of the country. Referring to the contempt cases in which he, Mr. Gompors, and Secretary Frank Morrison are out on ball, pending the de-cision of a higher court as to whether they shall go to jail. Mr. Mitchell says:
