SPOKANE, Wash., Jan. 22 .- (Special.)-The liquor question bids fair to be an important feature of the gubernatorial contest on the Idaho Republican ticket. A report from Boise says Governor Brady will come out for state-wide prohibition. Some of the Governor's supporters in Nez Perce County, Idaho, have leanings in that direction and the Boise dispatch was commented upon and the suggestion made that B. F. O'Neil of Wallace, Brady's chief rival, may be aligned with the anti-prohibitionists. Governor

Brady, however, has taken exception, through his secretary, Clarence C. Dietrich, to this proposition.

Mr. Dietrich, who arrived at Lewiston yesterday on a tour of the north, presumably in the interest of the Governor's candidacy for re-election, says Governor Brady has made no state-Governor Brady has made no state-ment which can be construed into an intention to boost for state-wide prohi-bition. If the Governor does not stand for the state-wide plank he may lose local Prohibitionist support to Paul Classtone, whose political emissaries are now in Lewiston in consultation with P. E. Stookey and other Prohibitionists.
