

SEATTLE CANAL IS OPPOSED BY MILLMEN

Home Interests Charge Agreements Were Violated in Locating Locks.

Ballard Protests by Wire. The Ballard Manufacturers' Association has sent a number of telegrams to Senator W. P. Frye protesting against the canal appropriation...

Through J. F. Ives, vice-president and manager of the Stinson Mill Company and president of the Manufacturers' Association, the millmen of Ballard charge against the Chamber of Commerce...

"When we objected to the bonds," said he, "a delegation from the Chamber of Commerce went to Ballard. They agreed that if we would cease opposition to the bonds they would locate the lock at the height of the water in the front of the mills would not be disturbed..."

Assessment District Opposed. "Then followed the creation of a million-dollar assessment district, and the filing of the same with the County Commissioners, who at length refused to sit as a board of equalization on the grounds that the act containing a provision to that effect was unconstitutional..."

"When the canal people sought to have passed by the Legislature two bills appropriating money for the canal, we opposed them at Olympia. A delegation from the Chamber of Commerce asked for a conference with our organization. They agreed in writing to locate the lock above the mills in consideration of our support of the bills. We withdrew our opposition, and the bills passed..."

"But the compact with the millmen has been ignored. When Representative Will E. Humphrey went to Washington last fall to secure the appropriation, Governor McGraw, and later was joined by City Engineer E. H. Thomson, in the rivers and harbors committee..."

"These acts constitute the second breach of faith. No course has been left to us except to declare war on the canal..."

"It is my firm conviction that the construction of the canal is an appalling calamity. The project has not a single redeeming feature. It is only 30 feet wide, while a modern battleship is 35 feet beam..."
