Permits Nearly Twice Those of August, 1909.

WEEK'S ISSUE IS \$522,050

Largest Single Building Started Is for Portland Railway, Light & Power Co., to Cost About \$250,000—Houses Begun.

That sudden access of activity in building permits, that set in with the month of August, still keeps up, and indications point to a still greater activity during the remainder of the month. Last week over a half million dollars' worth of permits were issued, making the total for the month so far \$1,439,240, nearly double the entire month of August, 1909, exact total of the past week was \$522,050.

FIRE SHOP DESTROYED SECOND TIME Within Three Years. HOQUIAM, Wash., Aug. 20.—(Special.)—Fire which destroyed the Davidson paint shop last night, doing \$7000 worth of damage, is said to have been due to spontaneous combustion. This is the second time Davidson has lost his entire stock in three years by fire. The excellent work of the fire department prevented the flames from spreading to adjoining buildings. The loss is covered by insurance.

Tucomed Are Running. SEASIDE, Or., Aug. 20.—(Special.)—The annual run of tom-cod started Thursday in Necanicum river and the fish are to be had in any quantity here today. The main bridge has been crowded with fishermen since sunrise this morning and the city officials were forced to place an officer at each approach to assist vehicles and pedestrians in crossing. After two weeks the fish return to sea and the run of Fall salmon begins.
