SALEM, Or., Sept. 17.—(Special.)—The Forty-Ninth Annual Oregon State fair is now a matter of history, but it will be recorded as one of the greatest ever held in the Northwest.

Closing, or Children's Day, was a huge success. Although the crowds had to splash through mud and water pools in many places they seemed to enjoy it. The pavilion was crowded and hundreds of stock.

Next to the races, the county exhibits were one of the greatest attractions, and the exhibits of Benton and Douglas counties were worthy of particular mention.
