

ARBITRATION IS REACHED IN STRIKE

Garment-Workers Are Said to Have Gained; Secret Agreement Reached.

COUNCIL'S APPEAL WINS

Fearing Financial Burden on City if Strike Should Continue, Committee Holds All-Day Session With Employers.

CHICAGO, Ill., Dec. 3.—(Special.)—

Through the influence of the City Council committee, which realized that a continuation of the garment workers' strike meant a big financial burden on the city, an arbitration has been reached between the firm of Hart, Schaffner & Marx and its 10,000 employees, who have been on strike for nearly two months.

With nearly 100,000 persons affected by the strike, it was rapidly becoming a serious problem to the city authorities. This mass of people, mostly foreigners, were destitute, and with the advance of cold weather the situation would have become a desperate one.

The Council committee conferred all day behind closed doors with representatives of the clothing makers, but details of the same are withheld until the terms are voted upon by the employees. It is known, however, that in the compromise the strikers have won substantial gains.

Two Watchmen Are Beaten.

While the representatives of the city and the employers were in session, working over a solution of the problem, the riots among the strikers continued unabated. Following the first fatality of the strike on Friday, when a strikebreaker, who was set upon by a crowd of pickets, shot and killed one of the strikers, two watchmen were to-

Strikers to Meet Today.

Under the terms of the proposed agreement reached today, the strikers will return to work at once, and all alleged differences will be submitted to arbitration. Plans for the meeting of the strikers will be held tomorrow, and the agreement put to them for ratification. The details have been kept secret because the leaders did not want the strikers to discuss them until they had been properly explained.

Wife-Lawyer Drops Suit

Cruel Husband Does Not Take Spouse to Club Ladies' Night.

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Dec. 3.—(Special.)—Mrs. Myrtle E. Havens, appearing as her own attorney in Department 8 of the Superior Court today, caused the dismissal of the second action which she has filed in a year against her husband, Arthur L. Havens, member of the Jonathan Club. Her first action was for divorce, alleging cruelty. This was set for trial in Department 4 July 26. Mrs. Havens, plaintiff, failed to appear, and Judge Hutton dismissed the suit. Mrs. Havens found a new attorney and threatened a second suit against her husband. Nothing came of that, and with a third attorney she filed an action asking for separate maintenance of \$100 a month. Today she caused herself to be substituted an attorney and dismissed the last action. The couple were married in Spokane, Wash., February 26, 1906. Mrs. Havens alleged her husband was cruel, because he would not take her to ladies' night at the club. She avers he would not live at the same hotel with her. He denied all the charges.

Kramer Wins Bicycle Sprint.

NEW YORK, Dec. 3.—In the sprint bicycle races today at Madison Square Garden, which preceded the annual six-day race, Frank L. Kramer won the international mile match race from A. J. Clarke, of Australia, and Walter Rutt, of Germany. His time in the first heat was 2 minutes 20 seconds, and for the second, which was cut to half a mile, 1 minute 5 seconds. Joe Folger of Brooklyn won the 10-mile professional race. Time, 22 minutes 53 1-5 seconds.

F. J. MILLER APPOINTED

New Railroad Commissioner Will Take Position Vacated by West.

CANNON IS UNTERRIFIED

Recent Unpleasantness Is Nothing Compared With Tornado of 1894.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 3.—Speaker Cannon is undisturbed over the recent political whirlwind, and he made this plain today when a member of the California delegation, which is here to

promote the plans for a Pan-American exposition at San Francisco, made a remark about the recent avalanche which struck the Republican side of Congress.

"My dear friend," said Speaker Cannon, throwing his arm over the man's shoulder, "I have been here for a good many years. I passed through the avalanche of 1894 and believe me, the recent unpleasantness compared with that of 1894 was as a gentle evening breeze compared with a cyclone."

The Californians visited the President at the White House today. Commenting on the fact that the San Francisco exposition was proposed to be held in 1915, Mr. Taft warned the party that the canal probably would be completed long before that date, and he spoke of the uncertainty of action by Congress, adding that he himself was somewhat in the attitude of the "man on the fence."

The Californians afterwards visited Vice-President Sherman and Speaker Cannon at the Capitol, escorted by the California Congressional delegation and introduced by Senator Flint and Representative Kahn.

LOVE NOT JAP MOTIVE

GREAT BRITAIN'S BELIEF IN FRIENDSHIP SHATTERED.

Mikado Giving Shipbuilding Contracts to Ally Because of Inability to Handle Same at Home.

LONDON, Dec. 3.—(Special.)—When Japan recently gave orders for a new dreadnought to be built in England and the proponents of the English-Japanese alliance were loud in referring to this act as having been inspired solely by a desire of Great Britain's Far Eastern ally to prove by friendship the pact was not obtained with the flavor of business bargaining, but simply intended gracefully to draw more tightly the "ties of alliance."

All this sentiment has been rudely shattered by Fred T. Jane, naval expert and student of international fighting ships. "The report that Japan, while leaving five of her own shipyards empty, has ordered a dreadnought to be built in England to show her admiration for the Anglo-Japanese alliance, is somewhat weak in the matter of assigned cause," Mr. Jane asserts.

"The actual facts appear to be that although Japanese yards are now fully capable of turning out moderately-sized vessels and very good destroyers, the building of monstrous battleships is rather beyond the capacity of their existing plants. This probably explains the tremendous delays in recent Japanese construction. It is far cheaper and expeditious to have a ship built outright in England than to import large quantities of material to be put together in Japan."
