## RACIAL TROUBLE ENDS IN SHOOTING

American Seriously Wounds Greek Sectionhand on Corvallis & Eastern.

PRISONER TO SALEM TODAY

After Firing Bullet Into Man Who Was About to Attack Him, John Webb Surrenders Self to Authorities and Goes to Jail.

ALBANY, Or., Feb. 18 -- (Special.)-As the result of enmity of a band of Greeks toward American workmen, who displaced them as section hands on the Albany section of the Corvallis & East-Ratiroad, a shooting affray occurred at 12:20 o'clock today at Niagara, in which John Webb, an American.

ara, in which John Webh, an American, shot and seriously wounded George Lapias, a Greek, and also fired on his brother, Lem Lapias.

Lapias was brought to Albany to-night and placed in St. Mary's Hospital. The builet hit him in the left side just below the heart, struck a rib and ranged downward, lodging in the body. Ontil the builet is found and its course in the intestines is ascertained the seriousness of the injury will not be known, but physicians believe the Greek is in a dangerous condition.

Webb gave himself up to Constable Prince Goodman of Mill City, who brought the prisoner to Albany tonight and placed him in the Linn County Jail Webb will be taken to Salem tomorrow, as the shooting occurred on tomorrow, as the shooting occurred on the Marion County side of the North Sentiam River.

Racial War Long Standing.

The shooting today is the outgrowth of racial trouble here four months ago. Webb went to work on the section here with a band of Greeks, who began causing him trouble. Because of their quarrelsomeness toward Webb. Foreman A. M. Fair discharged all the Greeks and bired americans. The foreigners made threats against Foreman Fair and also Webb, against whom they were particularly bitter because he were particularly bitter because he was the first American to displace

It is said by local raffrond men that George Lapias and his brother Lem have been seen lying in wait for Webb near his home at different times. near his home at different times.
About a week ago the Lapias brothers and other Greeks secured work at a Corvallis & Eastern rock quarry near Niagara, 32 miles east of Albany.
Webb was sent up there today with a worktrain to load rock. All forencen George Lapias muttered at Webb, calling him names in Greek After lunch

freerre Lapins muttered at webs, carring him names in Greek. After lunch this noon he came down to the cabcose as Webb stepped from it, a quarrel ensued and, as the Greek rushed toward Webb, the latter drew an automatic revolver and began to shoot. Lapine fell at the second shot. Len Laplas fell at the sacond shot. Lem Laplas then rushed toward Webb, who fired three times at him without effect. The injured man was taken to Mill City and later placed in the caboose of the worktrain, reaching here at 8 o'clock. In the same car Webb came as a prisoner.

Webb "Shot to Save Self."

Webb talked freely of the shooting when he reached here tonight, saying he believed the Greek was trying to carry out threats to kill him and shot to save himself. Lapias is a power-fully built man and Webb of medium fully built man and Webb of medium build. No weapons were found on the Greek when he fell. Though the ca-boose was full of workmen just fin-ishing tunch none saw the affray and the events which led to the shooting.

Webb is 23 years old and has a wife and two children. He came here about a year ago from Texas and has borne

good reputation.

The wounded man is about 35 years d. He and his brother Lem have been in Albany several months.

#### IMMUNITY BATH IS ASKED Bathtub Trust Says Evidence Given

Entitles It to Bath. DETROIT. Feb. 18 .- Alleging the in-

United States District Attorney Wat-United States District Attorney Watson filed a demurrer to the plea for dismissal. In the demurrer it is alleged
that answers such as made by the defendants in the civil suit in Maryland
are not of the nature contemplated by
the immunity statutes, in that these answers were made in a Court of Equity.


