

EX-WIFE SUES TO SECURE DAUGHTERS

Albert Sutton, of Hood River,
Directed to Produce
Them in Court.

MOTHER SEES CONTROL

Mrs. Montgomery, Formerly Prominent in San Francisco Social Circles and Divorced in 1908, Wants New Decree.

SAN FRANCISCO, May 13.—(Special.)—Mrs. Ethel Montgomery, wife of a wealthy real estate man, today petitioned the Superior Court for a second modification of the final decree of divorce granted her former husband, Albert Sutton, in 1908, wherein he was given the custody of their two daughters, Alberta, aged 15 years, and Anna, aged 14 years, so that their custody will be vested with her.

Judge Thomas F. Graham has issued a citation on the affidavits filed by Mrs. Montgomery, directing Sutton to produce the children in court in 35 days, that the matter may be threatened and the rights of the litigants determined.

Children Are at Hood River. Sutton for many years was a wealthy architect in San Francisco and at present lives in Hood River, Or., where he has his daughters. Prior to 1907 the Suttons resided here and were prominent in local social circles. In that year, according to a complaint for divorce filed by the husband three years ago, Mrs. Sutton deserted him. It is contended that she went to Paris with her children and that a chauffeur in the employ of Sutton at the time accompanied them.

At any rate, Sutton followed and in Paris secured his two daughters, whom he brought back to San Francisco with him and immediately afterward filed suit for divorce. A decree was granted by Judge Graham and she visited her daughters until, she says, they were taken away to Oregon by her husband, who, she charges, is trying to poison their minds against her. Soon after the departure of the former husband and daughters to the north, Mrs. Sutton remarried.

In the modification sought for now, she asks that she be given absolute custody of the children. She declares this is necessary, because she believes her husband intends permanently to reside outside of California, and she, living here, will be exiled from her offspring.

INFORMER MAKES SLIP

Abbateggio May Be Indicted for Camorra Murders.

VITERBO, May 13.—The prosecution has asked that Abbateggio, the informer, be indicted as an accomplice in the murder of Genaro Cuccolo and his wife. The request was founded on the testimony made by Abbateggio in today's session of the Camorra trial, when he again was accused by Enrico Alfano of being the actual head of the Camorra. President Bianchi declined to make the order.

Today's exchange between Abbateggio and Alfano had to do chiefly with the actual murder of the Cuccolos. When the informer repeated his testimony already given Alfano replied that, wishing to be indulgent, he could only imagine that his accuser had had dreams.

When Abbateggio was asked why his share of the reward for the crime was \$50, while the actual murderers received only \$20 each, he replied, "because either the Camorrista feared me or thought me useful."

It was this last statement of the informer that led the crown prosecutor to ask for his indictment.

STUDENT SEEKS TO DIE

Suicide of Mystic Followed by Attempt of His Pupil.

NEW YORK, May 13.—As a sequel to the suicide two days ago of Dr. W. R. Clifton, physician and magazine writer, Miss Alta Marhovich, his student and aid, attempted to kill herself in her apartment early today. She was taken unconscious from a gas-filled room to a nearby hospital, where it was thought that her recovery is unlikely.

The police declare that the young woman's act was undoubtedly part of a suicide pact with her friend and teacher. The girl told the police yesterday of the studies which she and the doctor had pursued in Indian mysticism, Eastern theosophy and mystic psychology, declaring hysterically that to neither of them did suicide seem a crime.

"Only his body is dead," she said. "His astral body still lives and my soul waits in union with his. We shall meet again ere long."

FIGHT IS ON AGAIN MONDAY

Sebate Will Renew Attempt to Elect President Pro Tem.

WASHINGTON, May 13.—Changing their attitude over night, the Republican Senatorial leaders announced that balloting for President pro tem of the Senate will be resumed when the Senate meets Monday. They argue that inasmuch as the election has been entered on, it should be completed. In the absence of the Vice-President, it will be impossible to proceed with the consideration of the resolution for election of Senators by direct vote, and it is possible to tie up that matter until the election is disposed of.

POWERS OUTWIT JAPANESE

Government Bitterly Attacked for Allowing Chinese Loan.

TOKIO, May 13.—Reports from Peking, concerning American intentions in Manchuria, are embarrassing to the Japanese Government, which is bitterly

by attacked by the opposition on the ground of its alleged weakness and inability to maintain its position regarding Manchuria. It is charged with being outmaneuvered by political intrigues in China, and by the other powers.

Assurance is given that Japan has received no official confirmation of the conclusion of the contract for the four-power \$500,000 currency loan to China. This government has not been consulted by its British ally or the other nations interested.

STRIKES STOP BUILDING

QUARREL BETWEEN UNIONS TIES UP WORK OF 15,000.

Chicago Plumbers and Steamfitters Disagree and Brickmakers Cause Brick Famine.

CHICAGO, May 13.—(Special.)—Fifteen thousand men are idle today in the busiest season of the year and buildings contracted for to cost \$35,000,000 are practically tied up as the result of the petty jurisdictional war being played between the plumbers and steamfitters. Every trade in the building industry is paralyzed and work on 1250 buildings is halted.

The strike of brickmakers also is adding greatly to the tie-up. Hundreds of men reported for work today, only to be told that there was nothing to do.

"We have no brick," was the remark of the foremen.

The brickmakers' strike, which involves workmen in every brickyard within a radius of 70 miles of Chicago, began three weeks ago, when 2500 men went on strike. At that time there was a two-weeks' supply on hand. This supply was exhausted last Monday.

John A. Alpine, international president of the plumbers, and Simon O'Donnell, business agent of that union, failed to appear at the conference scheduled for Friday afternoon.

Another chance will be given the plumbers' representatives to meet the steamfitters' committee in an effort to settle the difficulties. Unless the plumbers' representatives are present at this meeting, which has been set for next Tuesday, drastic action will be taken by the employers.
