Plans Being Laid to Make Coming Northwest Regatta Big Event.

PORTLAND CLUB IS ACTIVE

President Judge Sends Notification to All Rowing Associations of Meet Here—Races Held Over "White House" Course.

Carman of the Northwest will assemble in Portland July 7 and 8 for the annual regatta of the Pacific Northwest Association of Amateur Oarsmen.

The races will be held over the "White House" course, lying from a bend in the river at Milwaukie northward to the Halfwood ferry, one of the very few miles and a half courses in the United States.

The junior races will be held on Friday, July 7, and the senior events on Saturday, July 8. It is believed a full entry will be made from the Northwest clubs.

First Regatta in Seven Years. Not since 1904 has a North Pacific championship regatta been held in Portland. At that time the regatta was the "White House" course, which at that time was a great way from the city.

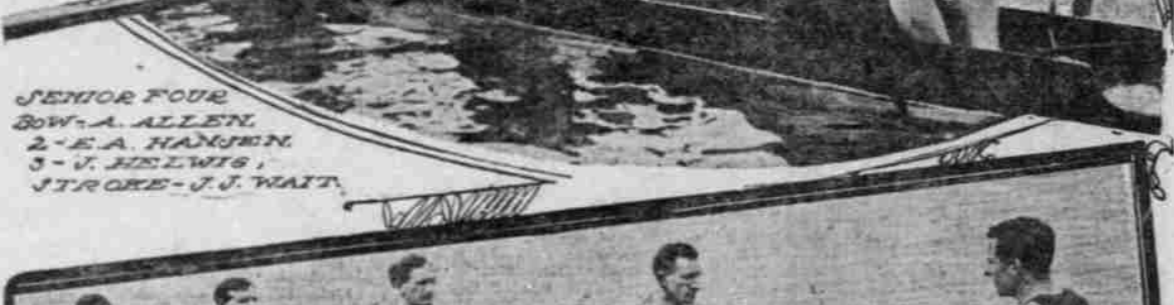
