

4-ROCKING CHAIR. Made in Portland in 1853-54 by John B. Garrison. 5-OLD-FASHIONED BICYCLE, of the type in use in 1874. 6—CRADLE, used in Oregon 50 years.

7-OX YOKE. Made in Ohio in 1842, and brought across the plains on the neck of two cows. Owned by Joel Perkins, a ploneer of Yamhill County.
S-SMALL SPINNING WHEEL, made in Norway. Very old.
9-LADY'S SIDE SADDLE, made in

Yamhill County in 1847 by Nathan Eaton, a pioneer of 1843, for Mrs. John Phillips, a pioneer of 1845, who used it for fifty years.

16—BLOCK OF MAIN SPRUCE. This was taken from a sill of the first frame house erected in Portland and was shipped from Maine via Cape Horn to Oregon in 1847 by Captain Nathaniel Crosby. Nathaniel Crosby.

11—SADDLE BAGS. Made in Wayne County, Indiana, for John H. Hunt, who brought them across the plains

in 1847, who settled in Waldo Hills, Marion County. He used them con-stantly until 1876.

12—STONE IMAGE. Made by Indians a great while ago, hundreds of years, without doubt. Washed out of the northern bank of Sauvie's Island, a few miles below Portland, on the farm of Martin Gillihan, a pioneer of 1844, and found by him. 13-STONE IMAGE. Found on Sauvies Island. Was washed out of the bank as indicated above.
