

FOUR OUT IN RACE FOR BRADY LEADER

Governorship of Gem State Alluring to Quartet Who Seek Honors.

CLAGSTONE IS LOCHINVAR

Through Direct Primary Election for Nomination of Candidates Is Year Distant, "Call of Wild" Has Been Heard Afar.

BOISE, Idaho, July 1.—(Special.)—Although the direct primary election for the nomination of candidates of the respective parties in Idaho is a year away, there are four candidates for the Republican nomination for Governor, and more or less active in the exercise of industry looking to a gratification of political ambition.

Three of these are from the north and one from the south, and it is safe to relate in passing that these four men do not possess the sum total of Republican ambition in this particular direction. Four ex-Republican Governors stand by looking on with jealous optics at the effort of Paul Clagstone, J. P. Allshie and Stephen D. Taylor, of the north, and H. S. Swenson, of the south, to capture the distinction. These are William J. McConnell, John F. Morrison, Frank R. Gooding and James H. Brady.

Clagstone is the latest "Lochinvar" to "come out from the West" and his proposal to again submit himself comes as a surprise to many who reason along natural political lines.

Political History Two Years Old.

Clagstone was first heard of in the political arena of the Gem State when he came to the Legislature from Kootenai County in the Winter of 1909, as a candidate for Speaker, and won. During the session he made a few close friends among the House members, the leading ones being McCracken, of Ada, and Thompson, of Canyon County, both of whom have been active in spurting him on to gubernatorial honors. In the campaign one year ago, Clagstone came out for state-wide prominence, and first so to announce, and later when Brady lit on a platform pledging this reform, he found Clagstone to be first in title in the hearts of those who would make him issue a "kick" pin of the campaign. By this Clagstone felt he had more prohibition votes within the Republican party, which Brady expected.

On the night of the count of the direct primary result, Clagstone issued a statement from Spokane in which he promised to support the party which he professed to have taken up with the proof at hand that both his opponents for the nomination, Brady and O'Neill, had spent money to buy the nomination. Clagstone later issued a statement in which he threatened to apply only to Brady, who had won in the primaries.

Clagstone came to Boise and engaged a lawyer to travel with him. He burgled and procured the story of the Gibson-Brady purchase of the Rexburg Standard, and returned to Boise, where he consulted additional counsel and responded to interviews in assurance of his determination to fight.

Then came on the state platform committee meeting and the gathering of the party leaders. At the close of this function, Clagstone, like the Arab of old, "quietly folded his tent and stole away" and later he was heard of at the Alene City, near his stock ranch, presiding at one of Governor Brady's campaign meetings.

Allshie on Second Term.

Judge Allshie is serving his second term as a Supreme Court Justice. He is adroit in politics and the most abnormal ambitious man in the state today. Those who know Judge Allshie best credit him with a burning desire to go to the United States Senate. They view him as a man who is not content with the chair of the stepping-stone brand of politics. While the Judge quarrels with nobody, he makes clear his own desire to succeed Heyburn from the north. Heyburn resides in Shoshone County, while Allshie votes in Idaho, and adjoining county.

So far as Allshie's opposition to Heyburn is concerned it is but passing. Had Borah no better grip on the people than Heyburn, the Judge would as readily aspire to the Governorship of Heyburn as he does of Borah.

S. D. Taylor is the Auditor of the state. He is serving his second term. He hails from the northern county of the state, Bonanza, and is the most northern town of any size, Bonner's Ferry. When at home Taylor is the editor of his weekly paper, the Bonner's Ferry News. For nearly a quarter of a century he has been in the newspaper business in Idaho and his fellow craftsmen take quite kindly to his ambitions.

It is fair to say of Taylor that his ambitions are viewed with sincerity by the Governor and the Legislature. He has fixed ideas on the question of assessment and collection of taxes and of handling the funds of the state, which he hopes to fasten on statute books and in the hearts of the people.

Sweetser Passes for Farmer.

Lewis H. Sweetser is a South Idaho candidate, living in Cassia County. Sweetser passed for a farmer. He is a Yale man and has been twice Lieutenant-Governor of Idaho. His campaign is not taken with any great degree of sincerity. He is a pleasant, affable gentleman; talks well and often for print but avoids advocating any original plan to improve the Bonanza, the mental or the moral standard of affairs in the state.

The ex-Governors all have their friends for party leaders, but all have their "toppers." W. J. McConnell was Governor from 1893 to 1897 and is regarded as a "has been." Besides he is the father-in-law of Senator Borah. He is now a Federal employee and in his travels over the state is taking sharp exceptions to the manner in which Governor Hawley and all other Governors are conducting the affairs of their respective offices. His arguments are chiefly constitutional in character and more or less profound for a layman to originate.

J. T. Morrison held the chair of Governor in Idaho for one term only, 1893-1895. He was talented, clean and honorable but had lots of trouble with the politicians. He was turned down for a second nomination and his following in the state has always urged his right to further recognition, especially as the executive of his adopted state.

Governor Gooding served two terms, succeeding himself by a greatly reduced majority over the remainder of his party ticket. He gave his entire time to the office and did the best he knew with the high trust. His inexperience

tion of the ideas of La Follette took such possession of him during the closing months of his regime as to set him firmly in opposition to the railroads of the state, of which the people are in need of more. This idea, coupled with his radical prohibition views serve to beset his ambitions with united opposition of a formidable character.

Brady Still Has Following.

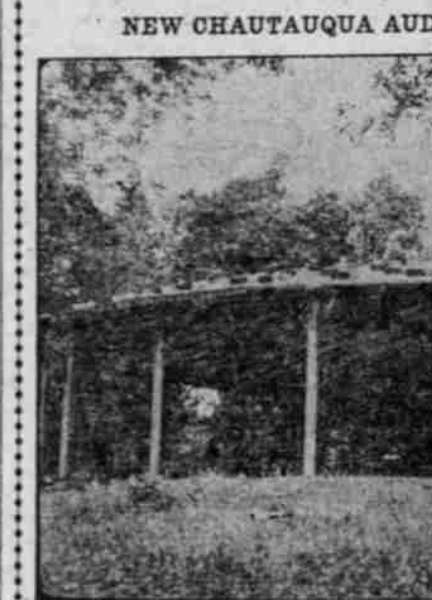
Governor Brady has a following which served him but a few months since in state positions, which makes him a quantity to reckon with in the race. He was defeated, however, in the election last Fall, when the remainder of his ticket pulled through, thus hampering, to considerable extent, his stock in trade for re-nomination.

Clagstone's candidacy mixes the situation in the north, leaving odds for the seven northern counties in Taylor's favor but making Allshie the most formidable candidate, because of his better standing with the Moravia of the southeast, who hold the balance of power.

Other candidates for Republican gubernatorial honors may appear. The time is not at hand for favorites. Among other new men of business acumen and stern party regularity are Ray Bowerman, the St. Anthony banker, John M. Haines, the ex-Mayor of Boise, and Barney F. O'Neill, the state chairman who went to defeat as a candidate last year through a right-of-way fear, as state chairman, that Brady could not defeat a popular Democratic nominee.

Governor Hawley is not the nominee of his party, the Democratic, as

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his own successor, it appears now that it will be owing to his voluntary refusal, for none other than he is mentioned as opposed to whomsoever may be the 1912 Republican candidate in Idaho.

LEGAL POINT IMPORTANT

EASTERN OREGON CASE PASSED ON BY ATTORNEY-GENERAL.

Schoolhouse, Erected, on Unpatented Government Land, Does Not Become Part of Freehold.

SALEM, Or., July 1.—(Special.)—A legal point which has created considerable interest in Eastern Oregon was passed upon in an opinion of Attorney-General Crawford this week in response to a request from District Attorney F. W. Wilson, of The Dalles. A school district near Madras erected a schoolhouse on unpatented Government land, which was later taken up by a private owner. The school district contended that the schoolhouse belonged to him under the old rule, that the schoolhouse became a fixture and part of the realty. This opinion was concurred in by the District Attorney, who, however, passed it up to the Attorney-General.

The Attorney-General cites an Oregon case in which it is held that the old rule governing fixtures has become greatly relaxed under modern conditions. He states that the school was not constructed as an accessory to the realty, but as a separate building. It is not necessary to, and cannot be used for, purposes of agriculture and is not such a structure as an agricultural occupant of the soil would construct for his own benefit and that originally the building was constructed for public use and was not placed on the land with the intention of it becoming a part of the realty.

In his opinion, basing it on these grounds, he states that the schoolhouse does not become a part of the freehold and that it could be removed by the district within a reasonable time. He goes further by holding that the district may even condemn the land on which it is situated if it so desires, the right of eminent domain having been extended to school districts by a statute of several years' standing. He holds that the schoolhouse would be required to pay in starting condemnation proceedings, but the district would be required only to condemn for the reasonable market value of the land taken into consideration.

OIL AT STONE IS FOUND

Portland Expert to Visit Strike for Thorough Investigation.

OREGON CITY, Or., July 1.—(Special.)—W. Mumpower, William Watts, Louis Vachon, of Sumner, interested in the oil wells at Stone, are much encouraged over the prospects of finding oil. The men employed there work 14 hours a day, and the drilling is at present suspended, owing to the installation of the casing, when there will be about 1400 feet.

D. M. Watson, an oil expert of Portland, will arrive during the coming week and visit the oil wells, at which time some of the stockholders of this city will accompany him to the wells, which are located about six miles from this city on the Vesper place and near the Watts place.

During the past week there has been about \$1000 stock taken out in the oil wells, not only by the people living in that vicinity, but also by some of the prominent residents of Oregon City. The Oregon City people's stock amounts to over \$2000.

Two Hurt in Premature Celebration.

EVERETT, Wash., July 1.—Julius Nelson, of Hartford, was brought to a hospital here today blinded by a rocket that struck him in the eye. Roy Imus, aged 5 years, was blinded in one eye and his other eye injured by a blast from the same rocket. The boy was struck by the rocket when he was playing with it.

SESSION OF FRIDAY

Albany Chautauqua Makes Up Splendid Programme.

NEW BUILDING IS ERECTED

Bryant Park Is Ideal Site for Summer Gatherings—Auditorium Has Seating Capacity for 3000 Persons—Designs Unique.

ALBANY, Or., July 1.—(Special.)—The programme for the second annual assembly of the Albany Chautauqua Association is now complete and indicates that it will be one of the best Chautauqua gatherings ever held in the state. The assembly will begin next Friday, July 7, and will continue in session for 10 days, closing Sunday, July 16. The assembly will be held in Bryant Park, which lies on a peninsula between

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the Willamette and Calapooya Rivers. Just west of the business section of the city. It is a beautiful place for such a gathering.

The principal sessions of the Chautauqua will be held in a big new auditorium, which is nearing completion. This building will have a seating capacity of 3000. It is oblong in shape and is 140 feet long and 100 feet wide. It is 20 feet in height to the edge of the roof and 22 feet high in the center, and is supported by a combination wood and iron truss. The sides will be of canvas. The structure is unique in design and is admirably suited for its purpose.

The seating of this new auditorium is on the amphitheater plan. This arrangement was made easy because of the natural slope of the ground and the interior of the building has been hollowed out so that each seat will be higher than the one in front. On one side of the building is a stage 22 by 40 feet in size.
