

CITY WILL BE HOST

Rotary Club Delegates Due Here August 21.

SPECIAL TRAINS COMING

New York, Kansas City, Chicago, St. Paul and Minneapolis Will Be Represented by Delegations at National Convention.

Delegates to the second annual convention of the National Association of the Rotary Clubs of America, which will be held in Portland August 21, will come in special trains from the East.

Receptions Are Planned.

The special from Chicago will leave August 18, over the Burlington route, selected by the transportation committee for clubs east of the Rocky Mountains as the official route for the delegates.

All of the meetings in Portland will be presided over by Paul F. Harris, the originator of the Rotary idea, and president of the National organization.

Programme Is Elaborate.

The programme for the convention, published in the last issue of the National Rotarian, follows:

Saturday, August 19—Arrival of delegates in Vancouver; escorted to Seattle by the Seattle Rotary Club and entertained at the Rainier Hotel.

Sunday, August 20—Entertained in Seattle and Tacoma by the local rotary clubs.

Monday, August 21—Arrival in Portland. Morning from 9 to 12, presentation of credentials by delegates; report of credentials committee and recall of officers and delegates; reports of officers; appointment of committees on resolutions and nomination of officers; discussion opened by D. L. Cady, of New York, on "In What Proportion Should Business and Sociality and Civic Work be Mixed in a Rotary Club?"

Tuesday, August 22—Excursion to Cascade Locks and return with dinner at Bonneville. Evening: Meeting of general committee to elect three directors for National Association; meeting of committee for nomination of officers; "Round Table" session for club secretaries to discuss ways and means of handling the office of secretary of a rotary club.

Wednesday, August 23—Morning: miscellaneous business, discussion opened by R. B. Denny, first vice-president of the National Association, on "What is the Platform Upon Which All Rotary Clubs Can Stand?"
