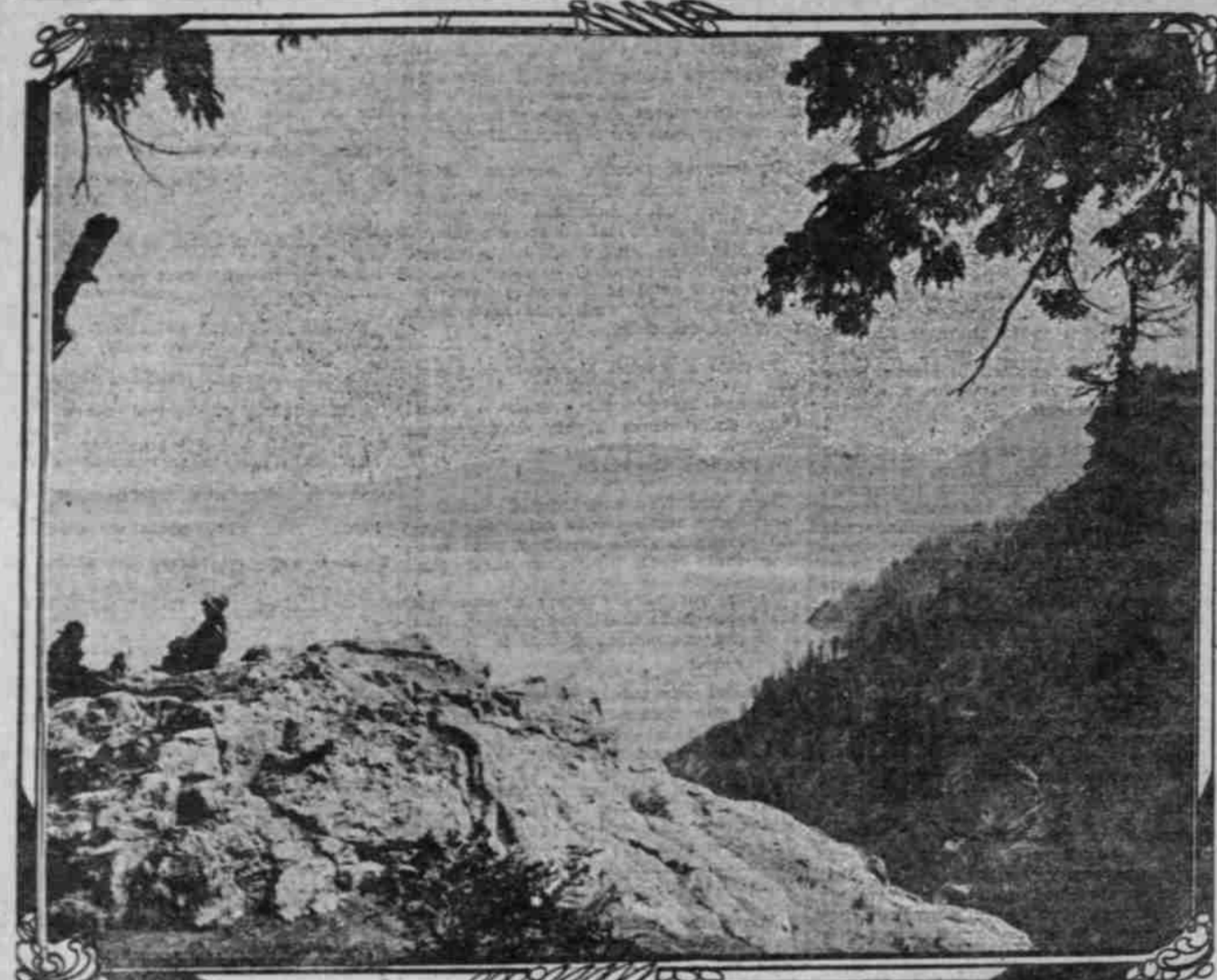


ROUTE TO WONDERLAND IS EASY; TREASURE HOUSE OF SCENERY OPEN

New Wagonroad From Medford to Crater Lake Makes Oregon Resort as Easy of Access as Other Magnificent Works of Nature, and Marks Close of Long Campaign.



LOOKING CRATER LAKE

WITH the completion of the wagon road now building from Medford to Crater Lake, Oregon's famed scenic wonder will be easily accessible to all travelers. Although much work has been done on this project within the present year, it is far from being completed. Difficulties in securing financial aid with which to carry on the work has delayed progress. The campaign for the construction of this highway has been waged for the last three or four years. As the lake is a state asset and the Nation's property, the interest in efforts to place it in closer touch with every lover of nature and the beautiful has attracted widespread attention. Several years ago the State Legislature appropriated \$100,000 for the work, but after plans had been drawn payment was withheld on the ground that the law under which the appropriation was obtained was unconstitutional. Undismayed, Rogue River Valley people who had been instrumental in obtaining the state's promise of assistance started a campaign for funds by private subscriptions. They succeeded in raising \$25,000. E. P. Haldel, United States Engineer, prepared plans for repairing the old county road connecting Medford and Fort Klamath. Furnice Hill, the greatest obstacle in the way of the road, was cut to an excellent grade, but the 2.2 miles of highway thus created was secured at a cost of \$11,000. Part of the funds were appropriated by the County Court, while other money was raised by the Medford Commercial Club. Several firms and individuals also subscribed to the fund, but later repudiated their promise to pay. Now the Medford Commercial Club is endeavoring to collect on these subscriptions. The total amount involved in these delinquent accounts is in excess of \$25,000. More than \$25,000 already has been expended, but half the work has not been done. The proposed road is 51 miles long. Everyone who has visited Crater Lake has gone into ecstasies over its scenic grandeur, and all are enthusiastic supporters of the scheme to build the road from the valley below to its shores.
