

BRIDE TELLS HOW SHE SHOT HUSBAND

With Pistol in Hand, Impulse to Pull Trigger Proves Irresistible.

HONEYMOON IS HAPPY ONE

Parents Object to Wedding With Foreigner, So Couple Go to Los Angeles, After Courtship in Oregon City Grocery.

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 18.—(Special.)—"I do not know how it all happened. The gun was in my hands. My husband was standing before me. My finger was on the trigger. Then an irresistible desire crept over me to twitch my finger, just to see if the trigger would work. I did not even know the gun was pointed toward my husband. Then came the explosion. It seemed to me to shake the room. I did not see my husband fall. I did not know he was shot. I saw his body on the floor. I knelt at his head and asked him to speak to me, but he was dead."

In these words, told between sobs and convulsions of grief shaking her slender frame, Mrs. Jessie Saraceno, the pretty American bride of an Italian, told the story of the accidental shooting which caused the death of the man to whom she was married 12 days ago.

Love Born in Grocery. "We were very happy," the girl said. "I met Mr. Saraceno a year ago. It was after I came back from business college. In Spokane, he conducted a grocery in Oregon City and I called there one day to make a purchase. Then I called again. I could not help loving him."

"My husband had a beautiful voice. I played on the piano. We were practicing the organ together. He was fond of music. So was I. We spent many a happy hour together singing and playing. Then came."

All Happens in Instant. The widowed bride went on as a shadowy figure said her face: "Only 12 days ago we arrived in Los Angeles and were married and rented an apartment. He brought me some rolls of music and we played and sang. I had never imagined we could be so happy. "Nick was moving a trunk into a corner. The gun was in the path of the trunk. I picked it up and asked him if it was loaded. He told me it was not. I touched the gun. I did not know where it pointed. In fact I can't tell how it happened. It was all done so quickly. I only know that my finger was on the trigger. Then I felt a great snap it just for fun. I bent down on it just a little. It did not yield, and I pulled a little harder. The shot followed and the flash and noise confused me for a moment. I half turned, expecting to be chided for allowing the gun to go off, and half wondering what the neighbors would think of the noise."

IDAHO MINE CASE SETTLED

Most Valuable Claim Now Taken Over by Chicago Man.

MOSCOW, Idaho, Nov. 18.—(Special.)—Hamilton Voss, trustee in bankruptcy for the Muscovite Mine Mining Company of Milwaukee, Wis., yesterday was given decree quieting title to the company's most valuable mining claim by Judge Deltrich in the Federal court, against Alexander Munro, the First Trust Company Bank of Moscow, and the Potlatch Lumber Company, defendants.

The results of this case, which has occupied the Federal court for a week in a tedious trial, covering a long period of time, since the Mica mines were first discovered and worked in 1882 by ex-Governor McConnell, of Idaho, G. B. Dennis, of Spokane, and his associates, are that the option now held by William H. Sills, of Chicago, is to be exercised and the big mining property is to soon be the scene of active operations on a larger scale than ever before contemplated.

Mr. Sills, who has been here ever since the beginning of the November term of the Federal court, left today for Avon, this county, near which place the mines are located, to take legal possession.

RANGE BREEDING SHOWN

Government to Make Exhibits at Woolgrowers' Convention.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 18.—The Department of Agriculture will be among the exhibitors at the International Livestock Exposition to be held in Chicago December 2-9 and the National Midwinter Sheep Show in connection with the National Woolgrowers' Association convention in Omaha, December 15-16. The Government entry will be two yearling sheep, bred and owned by the Department.

Secretary Wilson ordered today that this exhibit be made so as to afford sheepmen the first opportunity they have had to observe the progress of the experiment in breeding range sheep started by the department in 1906 and still maintained at Laramie, Wyo.

OPEN MAIL HOLDS \$16,000

Government's Payment to Colorado Travels in Unscaled Envelope.

DENVER, Nov. 18.—When Secretary Malone went through Governor Shafroth's mail today he discovered \$16,000 in an open envelope. The envelope was addressed in his handwriting, "State of Colorado," and was franked from the Department of the Interior in Washington.

All the envelope contained was a warrant for \$16,000, the sum due the state as 5 per cent of the amount taken in for the sale of agricultural lands in Colorado.

LONG LIFE MADE STUDY

Possible Instructors More Than 95 Years Old Number \$0,000.

CHICAGO, Nov. 18.—Instruction in how to live more than 95 years, based on the experience of those who have reached that age, is one of the purposes

of a "school of self-preservation" which has just been established here. It is planned to publish biennially a directory of all persons in the United States who have reached this age. It is said at the present time there are about 30,000 of these. Tabulated reports will be made up from forms of interrogatories submitted to these persons, showing the manner of life, the habits, diet and other particulars of those who have enjoyed good health and have lived to a great age.

NOTED ELECTRICIAN DIES

Caryl Haskins Also Known as Inventor and Writer.

SALT LAKE CITY, Nov. 18.—Caryl Davis Haskins, of Schenectady, N. Y., one of the most prominent electrical engineers in the United States, died here today from pneumonia after two days' illness.

Mr. Haskins was manager of the lighting department of the General Electric Company, and inventor of an auto-irrigable torpedo. He served throughout the Spanish-American War as second in command of submarine mining operations in the Boston district. He was also known as a writer of fiction and verse.

Policeman Killed Hit by Auto.

Struck by an automobile bearing an Oregon license, No. 84, listed to S. C. Knapp, of 717 Corbett building, Special Policeman Peter Kalich was knocked down and, it is thought, seriously injured at Williams avenue and Russell street late last night. He was taken to his home. A companion was with Kalich when the auto struck him. Kalich was crossing the street when the machine, running at a high rate of speed, came upon him. 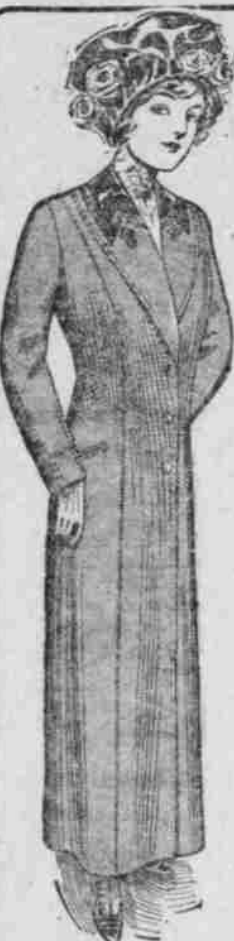
