

SOCIAL CAMPAIGN TELLS ON DUCHESS

Her Grace of Marlborough is Suffering From Serious Nervous Breakdown.

COURT FAVOR IS SOUGHT

Rule That Women Separated From Their Husbands Not Be Received at Court Gives Worry to Mistress of Sunderland.

LONDON, Feb. 10.—(Special).—The Duchess of Marlborough has gone to Cannes, suffering from a nervous breakdown. Her great activity in social and philanthropic movements, by which she hopes to gain favor at court, are said to have undermined her health. She will remain at Cannes six weeks, under the care of physicians, who have ordered her to take a complete rest. There is a rule that any woman separated from her husband shall not be received at court and it is being more rigidly enforced by King George than it was during the reign of his father. As the Duke and the Duchess of Marlborough are separated, the Duchess has been obliged to fight vigorously for her social position. She has been tireless in her work for philanthropic measures and has won the praise of friends of the King, who have not failed to point out her good works to him. Her correct life and devotion to her sons are said to have impressed the King also. But these activities have seriously impaired the Duchess's health.

Household in Uproar.
The recent actions of the Duchess have thrown consternation into her household. She has done some rather queer things. Shortly before Christmas she planned a trip to Beauville. She suddenly changed her mind and selected Brighton. Then she changed her mind again and booked passage for America on the liner Mauretania. On the day the liner was to sail she cancelled her bookings and returned to her town residence, Sunderland House. She made a flying visit to Waldorf Astor's place, then returned to mope in Sunderland House.

The Duchess, in fits of anger, discharged her butler and her secretary. She took upon herself the minute details of the management of her household, which contributed to the breakdown of her health. Her maid said she couldn't stand it any longer and threatened to leave.

Recovery Is Expected.
Six weeks under proper care at Cannes are expected to restore the Duchess's health. Then she is expected to redouble her efforts to create a favorable impression upon the King and Queen. Her latest project is a model lodging-house for needy women who work. She has enlisted the aid of Lord Curzon in the enterprise. She has delivered numerous speeches on the need of uplift for the working classes.

It is said that the Duchess is more estranged than ever from the Duke. If she wins a place at court it will be because of her tireless efforts and will in a measure be a score against the Duke. The Duke having been rejected in many overtures for a reconciliation, is said to have accepted the situation, content so long as he receives the \$10,000 a year household allowance every year.

BANKRUPT PRINCE JAILED

Financier Who Lived in Style After "Failure" Sentenced for Fraud.

LONDON, Feb. 10.—Ernest Terah Hooley, who was one of the leading men in the financial world in London a few years ago, was sentenced today at the Old Bailey to a year's imprisonment on a charge of obtaining money fraudulently by representing as free of incumbrances some property he had sold to the complainant. Hooley was one of the leading financiers in England from 1890 to 1898, when he was declared bankrupt. He had been regarded as one of the wealthiest men of the country, acquiring his riches by the promotion of numerous companies. In 1896 Hooley launched a tire company, and is supposed to have made a profit of \$12,500,000. He owned many race horses and yachts, including the racing cutter Britannia, formerly the property of King Edward and possessed also several historic country seats.

After his bankruptcy he was known as the "splendid bankrupt," as he continued to live in princely style on money which he had placed in his wife's name.

FLAG DAYS DESIGNATED

Chicago Mayor Wants Stars and Stripes Displayed Oftener.

CHICAGO, Feb. 10.—Mayor Carter H. Harrison is of the opinion that there is not sufficient display of the United States flag. In a letter directed to those in charge of any city building the Mayor names 12 days on which he says the flag should be displayed. They are: Lincoln's birthday, February 12; anniversary of the sinking of the Maine, February 15; Washington's birthday, February 22; anniversary of the Battle of Lexington, April 19; Memorial day, May 30; flag day, June 14; anniversary of the Battle of Bunker Hill, June 17; Independence day, July 4; Columbus day, October 12; anniversary of the Battle of Saratoga, October 17; anniversary of the surrender of Yorktown, October 19; anniversary of the evacuation of Yorktown, November 23.

STUDENTS ARE SUSPENDED

Sophomores in Trouble for Giving Freshmen Icy Bath.

HOBOKEN, N. J., Feb. 10.—Nearly half of the 57 members of the sophomore class at the Stevens Institute of Technology here have been suspended as the result of a faculty investigation of a series of pranks on Thursday morning. The trouble followed the sophomore class dinner Wednesday night, when the class returned to the grounds of the institute and proceeded to storm a freshmen dormitory, smashing many doors and windows and ducking in a tub of icy water all the freshmen whom they could find.
