

DISCRIMINATION IS DARMEN'S CHARGE

Oregon Association Meets at Cleone and Decides on Plan for Relief.

COMMITTEE IS APPOINTED

Co-operation With Washington County Dairy Producers Is Settled and Meeting Called for One Week From Friday.

CLEONE, Or., March 8.—(Special.)—With an unshaken belief that they are being discriminated against, and with a firm resolve to seek some method of relief from the grip of the creamery and milk distributors of Portland, the members of the Oregon Dairy Producers Association met here yesterday and appointed a committee of three members, headed by H. S. Davis, to formulate a plan of procedure and report at another meeting to be held March 22.

Mr. Davis recently issued a week in Washington County and his report to the Association indicated the same dissatisfaction existing there that pervades the fraternity here. The cause there is slightly different, however, as nearly all the milk goes to the condensing plant at Hillsboro, but the rules for testing and the discriminations alleged to exist against high-grade milk are said to be factors in preventing the dairymen from getting the largest returns for their product.

Plan of Co-operation Settled. It was decided to co-operate with the Washington County people, so that when relief is secured in Multnomah County the Washington County producers would gain in advance by means of a plan of procedure and report at another meeting to be held March 22.

Statements and figures kept by the dairymen went to show that they now receive only about one-third of the retail price in advance by means of checks thus saving loss in unprotected milk, and a saving in bookkeeping; and by so controlling the supply that there would be no overflow of milk during the summer months.

Controlling Supply Suggested. Partnership Plan Opposed. During the debate it was asserted that the distributors are 25 per cent of the business or also discontinue their work. The dairymen think such an amount is much, but the plan to go into partnership with the creamery or milk distributor was opposed by several members, who were fearful of being "skinned" as they expressed it, and by the dairy men of their own and establish a plant in the city with a competent manager.

Examinations Said to Be Shown. It was further asserted that examinations is shown to some of the dairymen, both by the buyers and inspectors. Some declared that the methods now in vogue of examining the milk are small dairymen, whose herds are inspected while those with large herds are not.

Initiative Petition Out. Two Papers Circulated From Pacific Grange Bulletin Office. GRESHAM, Or., March 8.—(Special.)—Initiative petitions for a county highway bonding act, embodying two bills, the first creating the office of State Highway Engineer and the second providing for the holding of road district meetings for issuance of bonds, have just made their appearance. They are being issued from the office of the Pacific Grange Bulletin at Lents and are authorized by the executive committee of the Oregon State Grange.
