

FEDERALS READY TO RUSH REBELS

Orozco Learns of Proposed Attack by Big Government Force.

BATTLE NOT UNEXPECTED

Mexican Army of 3000 in Torreon Said to Be on Point of Making Expedition Toward Jimenez.

JIMENEZ, Mexico, April 6.—Concentration of rebel forces here and south along the route to Torreon is the most point in the programme of General Orozco, but it is not improbable that another battle will have to be fought in the neighborhood of Escalon.

The advance guard is said to be at Zavala. Unless an unexpected clash with the Federals alters his plans, Orozco probably will hold Jimenez as a general base of operations against Torreon for some time, since between here and the city there is no place, the region below Escalon being little better than a desert.

General Salazar will be occupied for a few days in his chase of Colonel Villa, who fled from Parral towards Rosario, Villa, however, is no longer feared, since it is known that he had such a small body of troops.

PARRAL, Chihuahua, April 6.—In the battle between rebels and federal various parts of the city were damaged. The Banco Minero was burned. When the Liberals entered the city they found it completely looted.

LEAGUE'S GROWTH RAPID Membership in California 80,000 and University's Pupils Number 25,000—Credit Destroyed by Fraud Order.

ST. LOUIS, April 6.—M. R. Murray, a former counsel for a trust company, testified today in the trial of E. G. Lewis, charged with using the mails to defraud, that the issuance of a fraud order by the government against the Lewis concerns destroyed Lewis' credit.

Murray said that Lewis had been a large borrower and that his application for a \$200,000 loan was refused when it became known that the fraud order was to be issued.

MISS JOSE WELL, who said she was a "creator" for the American Woman's League, in charge of its California membership, testified that the league grew rapidly in California and had 80,000 members. This testimony was ruled out by Judge Amidon.

Squire F. Brown, an instructor in the People's University, a subsidiary of the Lewis corporation, testified that the university had 25,000 pupils. District Attorney Houts objected to the defense's examining witnesses whose testimony had nothing to do with the charges against Lewis.

THORNET NOW IN JAIL MAN WHO PERMITTED LYMAN TO ESCAPE BELLIGERENT. Fugitive From Klamath Falls Tells Captor if Not Covered He Would Have Shot to Kill.

ALBUQUERQUE, N. M., April 6.—L. R. Thorne, who permitted John Grant Lyman, Panama Islands swindler, to escape from the Federal authorities in Alameda, Cal., September 24, 1911, and who later escaped from custody in Klamath Falls, Or., by digging his way out of jail, is in jail here, having been arrested on a ranch in Mora County, New Mexico.

THORNE was covered with a sun by Deputy United States Marshal Smith, of Albuquerque. "If I had seen you first I would have killed you and then killed myself," was Thorne's remark when arrested. He will be taken to San Francisco tomorrow.

ROAD BUYS IN CORVALLIS Oregon Electric Pays \$25,000 for Depot Site in College Town. CORVALLIS, Or., April 6.—(Special.)—The Oregon Electric Company today acquired a half block on Third street through the Watters Realty Company.

The consideration was \$25,000. This property will be used for depot purposes and is centrally located. The several residence buildings now on the grounds will be removed and a handsome station of stone or brick erected.

The Oregon Electric will not enter the city proper until next year, as it will be impossible for the company to bridge the Willamette before that time, but trains will be running to the east bank of the river by early fall.
