Percentages Tell Why Trio of Teams Lead in Northwestern League.

MOUND WORK EFFECTIVE

Strength of Vancouver, Spokane and Seattle Lies in Batting, Fielding and Extra Base Clouting as Well as Pitching.

It is not hard to discover why Vancouver, Spokane and Seattle are leading the Northwestern League when a peep at the team averages is taken.

Strength of the clubs expressed in batting, fielding and extra base clouting gives them a good margin over the second division teams.

Vancouver, which leads the circuit after a wonderful winning streak, has jumped to the fore in batting strength, with Seattle and Spokane following above the 250 mark.

Victoria pitchers have been the medium for much hit-averages batting, opponents hitting .280, while Spokane twirlers, allowing only .235, have been the moundmen who have clamped the brakes on aspiring clubmen.
