HOUSE INSISTS ON ABOLISHING COURT

Appropriation Bill Repassed, With Only Civil Service Provision Omitted.

SECOND VETO IS INVITED

Senate, While Opposing Continuation of Tribunal, May Vote to Leave Legislation Out of Appropriation Bill.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 17.—After a short debate, the House today re-passed the vetoed legislative, executive and judicial appropriation bill, still carrying the provision to abolish the Commerce Court, but lacking the provision to limit the tenure of office of Civil Service employees to seven years.

QUAKES CONTINUE DAILY

IMPORTANT LAW DISCOVERED

The section referred to is 5212 of Lord's Oregon Laws and is as follows: "That the Governor is hereby authorized to employ special agents for the apprehension and conviction of criminals and the return of fugitives from justice or to collect evidence in any case, civil or criminal, where the state is interested at such salaries as he may deem reasonable for the services rendered, whenever, in his judgment, it is necessary, from the conditions existing in any case, or where he is convinced criminals are likely to escape punishment and justice cannot be done, or is liable not to be done, by the regularly constituted authorities of any county of the state, or whenever any emergency has arisen which, in his judgment, would justify him in so doing."
