

JERSEY LILY SEES DELAY FOR BALLOT

Once Noted Beauty Says English Women Have Retarded Cause by Violence.

AMERICAN PLAN IS BETTER

Actress Interested in "Colorful" Scheme of Dress for Men, Whom She Finds at Present Too Monotonously Alike.

NEW YORK, Sept. 28.—(Special).—The youthful and elegantly gowned, Lily Langtry, or Lady de Bathe, as she is known off the stage, arrived this morning on the steamship Cedric with the latest news of the suffrage movement in England, in which she is directly interested. She had much to say also of agitation for an "artistic and colorful" dress for men, at which much is now being heard on the other side.

"I think that the English women have set their cause back five years through their violence. The equal franchise should be gained by the tongue, not the brick. American women have a much more satisfactory and effective plan in their progressive methods, and I am sure they will get the ballot long before it is obtained in Great Britain.

Men's Taste in Color Wretched.

"I am much interested in the innovations in men's dress which are beginning to crop out on the other side," said Lady de Bathe, changing the subject. "Side whiskers have returned, as you know, and the stock and ruffled shirt are being worn. Much is being said about adopting colors in both clothes and headgear, and I am heartily in favor of it myself. Men look so uninteresting and monotonously alike, and they have such wretched taste in color. I have gone so far as to organize a club the purpose of which is to revive the picturesque and historic dress of men.

"The success of fancy dress balls is proof enough that men are fond of beautiful colors and enjoy dressing in them."

Seriatim Innovations Proposed.

Here are some of the innovations for men which the Jersey Lily wants to see men adopt:

"Light blue or green satin trousers or knee breeches; satin tailed coats, colors according to taste; ruffled, lace, soft shirts with long lace wristbands; feathered beaver bonnets, like the kind we used to see in the 'costume' drama; colored leather pumps with buckles, or colored boots with satin spats; stock or lace neckpieces.

CELEBRATION IS PLANNED

Eugene Would Greet Oregon Electric and Its Proposed Excursions.

EUGENE, Or., Sept. 28.—(Special).—Following immediately upon the announcement of Hill officials that the Oregon Electric would run excursions, if not begin regular schedules, to Eugene on October 15, the joint committee of the Eugene Commercial Club and the Merchants' Protective Association last evening perfected their organization with the avowed intention of making the celebration of the coming of the Oregon Electric an event long to be remembered. J. S. Maglady was selected as chairman and M. J. Duryea as secretary-treasurer, and committees were named on finance, publicity, decorations, parade, music, invitation and entertainment and automobile parade.

Plans for the celebration were discussed only in a general way, but, among other things, it was decided that floats representing articles "made in Eugene" should be featured.

High officials, many of the Oregon Electric, but also of the Hill lines, including most likely L. W. Hill and perhaps Carl Gray, under whose direction the extension of the road was begun, will be the guests of the city. A banquet for the evening of the 15th is planned.

The Albany Commercial Club, at its recent meeting, decided to prepare for sending a large delegation to Eugene, repaying the visit of Eugene people to Albany the Fourth of July, when the Salem-Albany section of the road was opened for traffic.

TERMINAL REPORT IS FILED

Portland Company's Gross Corporate Income in Year 203,438.

SALEM, Or., Sept. 28.—(Special).—The gross corporate income of the Northern Pacific Terminal Company, of Portland, for the year ending June 30, 1912, was \$203,438, according to a report which has just been filed with the State Railroad Commission. Taxes accrued for the terminal amounted to \$164,201. The report shows a net total of \$2,137,123 expended for road and equipment by the terminal company since June 30, 1907. The total revenues for operation rather than from transportation during the year were \$59,732.

The report shows that the terminal company handled 188,859 freight cars for tenant companies during the year ending June 30, and handled 137,337 passenger coaches. The total number of cars handled by the terminal was 316,196. The total revenue for handling these cars was \$252,290. The amount received from tenant companies for handling these cars, exclusive of taxes, interest and sinking fund, was \$113,448. The operating expenses totaled \$514,337.

The report shows that the terminal company employed 293 people, including general officers. The total compensation for the year for these employees was \$242,471, or an average daily compensation of \$2.43.

HAZZARD ON WORLD JAUNT

Chehalis Army Man to Take Long Trip Soon.

CHEHALIS, Wash., Sept. 28.—(Special).—A mother's measureless love and pride shone from the eyes of Mrs. William Hazzard today as she displayed a letter from her son, O. P. M. Hazzard, First Lieutenant in the Second United States Cavalry, telling of a trip he is about to make practically around the world. At the present time he is stationed at Fort Bliss, Tex. Hazzard is one of the men who was principally responsible for the capture of Aguinaldo, the Filipino chief, during the Spanish-American War.

From Fort Bliss, Hazzard is to go to New York and about October 8 will sail for England, possibly on the President Lincoln. Places he will then visit are Scotland, Ireland, Germany, Holland, Denmark, Austria,
