SUSIE OWENS IS GUILTY

MANSLAUGHTER AGREED ON AS COMPROMISE. Acquittal Said to Have Been Procured by Prosecution Showing Immorality of Defendant.

Shortly before noon yesterday Circuit Judge Kavanaugh received a verdict of manslaughter from the jury which tried Susie Owens, charged with murder in the first degree for the killing of Charles Colegato.

The verdict was a compromise, some of the jurors being for acquittal while others wanted murder in the second degree, which carries an automatic penalty of life imprisonment.

Yesterday was a legal holiday and Judge Kavanaugh did nothing more than receive the verdict and dismiss the jury. The date of sentence was not set but it probably will be passed Tuesday.
