

CROWD PUTS BLACK PUGILIST TO FLIGHT

Threats of Lynching in Chicago Loop District Terrify Jack Johnson.

INKWELL SHIED AT HIM

Unidentified Man Drops Missile Out of Tenth-Story Window, Narrowly Missing Head of Dis-mayed Champion.

CHICAGO, Oct. 19. (Special.)—Threatened lynching in the heart of the Loop district today struck terror to the heart of Jack Johnson, the world's champion pugilist, causing him to abandon his own high-power automobile and flee from the angry crowd in a hired taxicab.

This demonstration against the negro prize fighter was but an incident in another day's struggle between the mother of Lucille Cameron and Johnson for possession of the pretty girl. The machinery of numerous courts, however, was used against the pugilist with such effect that he seemed nearer defeat tonight than since the remarkable contest began a week ago.

Girl Taken From City.

Johnson came face to face with the crowd when he walked out of the First National Bank building shortly after 2 o'clock in the afternoon. He had made a final visit to the bank to get the \$25,000 demanded as bail for Miss Cameron as a witness before the Federal grand jury next Tuesday.

Meanwhile the girl had been hustled out of the city to a jail in Rockford, Ill., to prevent Johnson getting her out on bail and marrying her.

It is said that Johnson's inside pocket contained a fat roll of greenbacks at the moment when he suddenly found himself the object of the enraged men and women in the street. The crowd had been attracted by the sight of Johnson's long black automobile, in which sat his bodyguard of two negroes and two white men.

"There he comes, get him now," cried a dozen voices as Johnson's glistening features appeared over the heads of those nearest the scene.

Champion Is Bewildered.

There was an angry movement on the part of the crowd and a moment later it turned toward him. Johnson was soon backed up against the wall, too bewildered to move. The usual attitude of the crowds that view him is one of curiosity and admiration and the change of front bewildered him.

While Johnson was facing the crowd in front of the bank an unidentified man dropped a large inkwell from a window on the tenth floor of an office building which narrowly missed striking the pugilist on the head.

It didn't take him long to decide what to do, either. His ten-horsepower arms were dug down as far into his pockets as they would go as he edged back into the door through the bank and out through another entrance. Then he summoned a taxicab and ordered the driver to take him to comparative safety of his "Cafe de Champion" as fast as gasoline could accomplish the work.

The entire city was busily discussing a rumor that Johnson had been shot by an enraged male relative of the Cameron girl when this incident occurred. Where the rumor originated nobody knew.

Act Violated Is Belief.

Authoritative information is at the hands of the Government that the Cameron girl was brought to Chicago in violation of the Mann act, according to a statement issued by United States District Attorney William H. Clegg.

"The Government is proceeding with caution in its investigation of Johnson's alleged association with white girls," said Mr. Clegg. "We have information from a reliable source that the Cameron girl was brought to Chicago for unlawful purposes by a woman who was in some way associated with Johnson."

Charged with the abduction of a white girl, Johnson was arraigned in Municipal Court today. His bond was increased from \$500 to \$1500, and the case continued until October 29.

Johnson became furious when Erbstein, attorney for Mrs. F. Cameron-Falconett, mother of the 19-year-old girl, demanded his bond be increased. "I don't think it is necessary to increase the bond," Johnson told the court. "I am a responsible citizen. I have a business worth \$60,000."

"It may be worth that to you," flashed back Erbstein, "but it's illegal, and you ought to be put out of business."

"All right, Mr. Mayor," commented Johnson with a laugh.

"If I was Mayor of Chicago, you wouldn't be in business three days," replied the attorney.

Judge Hopkins then placed the bond at \$1500, the usual amount in abduction cases. A professional bondsman posted the cash bond for the negro.

Two agents of the Government Department of Justice were present.

SUFFRAGETTE IN PRISON

Helen Craggs Sentenced to Hard Labor for Attempted Incendiarism.

OXFORD, England, Oct. 19.—Helen Craggs, militant suffragette, was sentenced today to nine months' hard labor at the Assizes on the charge of attempting to set fire to the residence of Lewis V. Harcourt, Secretary of State for the Colonies.

Miss Craggs, who is a daughter of Sir John Craggs, was discovered by a watchman with another woman in the grounds of Nuneham Park. When searched she was found to be carrying a quantity of inflammable material and spirits.

HAZING STARTS INQUIRY

DRUNKEN GAIAT JAILED

SEVEN SPOKANE OFFICERS FINALLY CAPTURE HIM.

Johan Johnson Wrecks Saloon in Bibulous Moment—When Sober He Is Gentle as Lamb.

SPOKANE, Wash., Oct. 19.—(Special.)—Johan Johnson, big as the side of a barn and possessed of a passion for destruction whenever he gets drunk, is again in the city jail, after a riotous half hour Thursday night, during which he wrecked the Bar Bee saloon at 205 Riverside avenue.

Six policemen, headed by Sergeant Bunker, led the attack on the terrible Johan, which finally brought him to an inglorious confinement in the strong box. During the battle he broke a plate glass, knocked over a hot stove in the room and then turned it into a missile by pitching it at his assailants. The stove crashed to the floor and its red coals added to the merry disorder of the scene and furnished suitable setting to Johnson's viking-like oaths. The man was measured up after being photographed today by Wesley Turner, police superintendent of identification, as a physical specimen of unrivaled size. He weighs more than 300 pounds.

He was released a while ago by Captain Miles after serving a short sentence. When first arrested, October 1, Johan fought six officers, whipped two big lumberjacks, threw a 400-pound safe out of his way and bit his watch chain in two when taken to headquarters. Robber he is a variable baby in action, although of prodigious bulk. When drunk he is crazed and irresponsible. The police, in order to prevent serious trouble for Johan, will forbid the sale of liquor to him.
