

BANK DEFAULTER IS BIGAMIST, TOO

Former Minnesota Cashier Under New Name Runs Picture Show in Georgia.

SECOND WIFE IS LOYAL

H. W. Parker, She Says, May Have Another Spouse, but Charles A. Long Is Hers and She Will Stand by Him.

WEST POINT, Ga., Nov. 30.—H. W. Parker, ex-cashier of the Bank of Commerce at Winnebago, Minn., in a signed confession tonight admitted a shortage of \$17,000 in his accounts, told of his flight from the Minnesota city, where he left a wife and three children, and of his marriage in Georgia to Miss Florence Bauer, a Cleveland actress.

Parker made his confession before a notary public and Mayor Johnson, of West Point, at whose instigation the banker was arrested while living here under the name of Charles A. Long. Parker owns a motion picture theater here.

New Wife Taken Last August.
Parker married Miss Bauer shortly after he came to Georgia last July. According to the detectives, the prisoner said his accounts in the Bank of Commerce became short \$15,000 last April because he had signed notes for friends which had not been paid.

Realizing that the bank examiners would discover the shortage, the prisoner took \$2000 in cash and came to Georgia. He went into business at West Point under the name of Charles A. Long, and a short time later was married in Atlanta. Officers say Parker insists his shortage is \$17,000.

Mayor Notes Resemblance.
The prisoner, it is said, has expressed a willingness to return to Minnesota to face the charges against him.

Parker was arrested at the instigation of Mayor Johnson, of West Point. Mayor Johnson noticed the resemblance between Long and a poster offering \$1200 reward for the arrest of the missing Minnesota banker.

Parker's actress wife is said to have made the following statement when she heard of the alleged confession: "If necessary, I will return to Winnebago with my husband. As H. W. Parker he may have had another wife, but as Charles A. Long he is my husband."

Minnesota officers are expected to reach West Point tonight or tomorrow to take the prisoner to Winnebago.

FATHER LANE HOME AGAIN

Delegate Returns From Eucharistic Congress in Vienna.

ALBANY, Or., Nov. 30.—(Special.)—After a trip of almost four months, during which he attended the great Eucharistic Congress at Vienna and traveled over large part of Europe, Rev. Father Lane, pastor of the Albany parish of the Roman Catholic Church, arrived at his home in this city last night. Father Lane was the only representative of the Pacific Northwest at the Eucharistic Congress.

Father Lane left Albany August 6 and went to Montreal, sailing from there for Liverpool. He crossed England to London and then toured France and Switzerland, spending some time in the Alps. He then went to Vienna, where he attended the big congress which was held from September 12 to 15 inclusive.

After the adjournment of the congress Father Lane visited Bohemia and Bavaria and then toured most of Italy. He spent a month in Rome, visiting many scenes of interest in the history of the church, and had an audience with the Holy Father. After leaving Rome he traveled along the Mediterranean Sea to France and then northward through France to Havre. He sailed from Havre on the La France, which made a record-breaking run to New York in 3 days and 18 hours.

Father Lane says, did he find any fruit or flowers that compare with those of this state.

OREGON CITY MAN PUZZLED

Mayor Would Know if Shaw Legally Is Chief of Police.

OREGON CITY, Or., Nov. 30.—(Special.)—To determine whether E. L. Shaw is Chief of Police, a complaint has been prepared calling upon him to prove he is legally entitled to the office. The complaint, which has been sent to District Attorney Tongue for his signature, was prepared by Attorney R. N. Hicks, and was signed by Mayor Dimick. The Mayor desires to prove it is said, that he was right when he ordered the removal of Shaw and appointed Charles E. Burns Chief. Burns, after service four months, simultaneously with Shaw, gave up the work and filed suit for his salary. Circuit Judge Eakin decided that, inasmuch as his appointment had not been approved by the Council, he was not entitled to the money.

If the decision should be against Shaw an effort might be made to deprive him of his salary, although he has been the only Acting Chief since Burns gave up the work, and also acted as Chief while Burns was serving. The Mayor having refused to sign Shaw's warrants, he has not received a cent of money from the city since January 1 this year.

ROSEBURG DEAL \$50,000

Portland Capitalist Purchases Building in Heart of Town.

ROSEBURG, Or., Nov. 30.—(Special.)—An important business deal was consummated here today, when C. W. Hopkins, a Portland capitalist, purchased the Grand Hotel building at a cost of \$50,000. The building is a three-story brick structure, and is located in the heart of the business district.

Other than housing the hotel the building contains a grill, cigar and poolroom and real estate offices. Mr. Hopkins also recently invested considerable money in Douglas County real estate, much of which was subdivided into small tracts and placed on the market.

INJURIES ARE TOLD

5179 Accidents Reported in State in 16 Months.

LABORERS KILLED ARE 164

Lumber Working Responsible for Largest Number of Injuries and Logging Fatalities Outnumber Others.

SALEM, Or., Nov. 30.—(Special.)—State Labor Commissioner Hoff today completed the record of accidents in Oregon for the months from May 30, 1911, to September 30, 1912, inclusive, to be used in connection with his biennial report.

Out of a total of 5179 accidents reported, 164 proved fatal. Sawmills and planing-mills led the list with 645 accidents, of which 16 were fatal. Machine shops and foundries were second with 644 accidents, of which two were fatal. Logging proved the most hazardous.

Trades and crafts reported less than 20 accidents are grouped under the head of "Miscellaneous." Blacksmithing, 40; bridge construction, 47; can manufacturing, 46; carpenters, 50; concrete, cement and paving, 28; construction, 58; electrical work, 185; furniture, etc., 27; logging, 461; machine shops, 64; miscellaneous, 281; total, 5179.

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The fatalities reported are: Brickyard, 1; bridge construction, 1; carpenter, 2; concrete, cement and paving, 2; construction, 12; electrical, 5; elevator operator, 1; fish cannery, 1; harvesting, 1; logging, 44; machine shops, 10; mining, 2; paper mill, 1; quarry, 10; railroad construction, 18; railroad section, 18; railroad train, 407; railroad yard, 498; sawmills, planing-mills, etc., 645; sawmill and planing-mill yards, 285; teaming, 52; warehouse and dock work, 38; woolen mills, 38; miscellaneous, 281; total, 164.

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
