ARCHBALD IN DEBT,

Witness Tells Why Judge Hesitated When Invited to Go on European Trip,

PROSECUTION IS CLOSED

Activity in Regard to Culm Bank Leases and Discounting of His Notes Subject of Inquiry as Case Nears End.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 14 .- The testimony upon which the House managers ask the Senate to convict Judge Arch-bald, of the Commerce Court, of misbehavior and misdemeanors in office was concluded today. On Monday at-torneys of the accused judge will begin the presentation of the witnesses for the defense.

Today's witnesses included C. Larue Today's witnesses included C. Larue Munson, of Williamsport, Pa.; Samuel H. Swingle, of the Premier Coal Company of Scranton; Fred W. Jones, of the Delaware & Hudson Coal Company; O. H. von Storck, a Scranton lawyer; W. W. Rishinger, a coal man of Scranton; W. M. Ruth, bank cashier of Scranton; J. R. Wilson, secretary of the Scranton, J. R. Wilson, secretary of the Scranton, Honduras Mining Company; Edward R. W. Scarle, clerk of the Federal Court in Middle Pennsylvania, and T. F. Farrell, of New York.

Most of the witnesses testified in regard to Judge Archbald's alleged activity in regard to the culm bank leases and the discounting of notes bearing his name. Munson and Searle were examined in regard to the raising of \$500 as a purse toward defraying Judge Archbald's expenses on a trip to Europe in 1910. Mr. Munson said he was asked to subscribe to the purse and that he declined because of his high regard for the judge and his desire not to embarrass him.

"I would like to say," added Mr. Munson, "that I always found Judge Archbald absolutely fair and impartial and that I never tried a case before a more honorable and upright Judge than he." Giving of Purse Recounted.

Mr. Searle declared that since testifying before the House judiciary committee he had refreshed his memory in regard to the purse and said the plan to give it originated in talk about giving a dinner to the judge before his departure for Europe. It developed that only cight or nine could attend the dinner so those who had planned the affair agreed to give the judge the money raised. They feared that the judge would refuse it and so put the money in an envelope marked "sailing orders, do not open until two days out."

to accept because those he owed might
feel that he should have used the
money it would have cost for the trip
in paying his debts.

judge's debts, He insisted that there
were debts, but that the judge's credit
was good.
