

MAN WHO LIBELED KING LOSES APPEAL

Journalist Still Insists That George V Contracted MORGANATIC MARRIAGE.

FACTS BEING GATHERED

Mylius Declares That Monarch and Mary Elizabeth Culme-Seymour, Daughter of Admiral, Were Wedded at Malta.

NEW YORK, Dec. 28.—(Special).—Edouard Mylius, the English journalist who was not permitted to land here on the ground he was an undesirable alien, since he had served a year in an English prison for the libeling of King George V, was excluded by a decision of the board of special inquiry before which he had a rehearing today.

Within the last week Mylius, who came to this country on board the steamship Providence as a third-class passenger, was ordered to be deported by the immigration authorities.

It was on a charge of uttering defamatory libel against King George that Mylius was found guilty last February in London and was sentenced to serve a year.

King Denies Story.
King George sent a vigorous denial of the story appearing in the Liberator, to the effect that the King, as Prince George, had contracted a morganatic marriage at Malta in 1894, a year before he married Queen Mary, with the daughter of Admiral Sir Michael Culme-Seymour.

Mylius, in an office at Ellis Island, this afternoon talked about himself and the article which brought all his trouble upon him.

"I believe today just as I believed in 1910 that King George of England, when he was Duke of York, married at Malta Mary Elizabeth Culme-Seymour, daughter of Sir Admiral Michael Culme-Seymour of the British Navy, and that there are several children by this marriage.

"I had sufficient data then to warrant the publication and since that time we have never ceased working on the case. We are working today and the fact that I came to America simply to make my living does not interfere with the work that is going on today.

"We have obtained the name of every sailor, every person aboard the Thrush, the gunboat which Prince George commanded when he visited Malta and Gibraltar at the time we think the marriage took place, and every one of these men is being seen. The work is going along in other directions and it will not stop, no matter what opposition or pressure we may confront as we get along."

DIVISION MAY MEAN LOSS

West Must Unite to Win Secretary of Interior, Is Declared.

OREGONIAN NEWS BUREAU, Washington, Dec. 28.—Among Democratic Senators who have talked recently with President-elect Wilson, there is considerable talk today to the effect that no Western candidate for appointment as secretary of the interior will receive serious consideration for that office unless he has the undivided support of the Democracy of his state. Attention has been called to the fact that Oregon Democrats have split over Mr. Teal and Mr. King; Washington Democrats are scattering in their endorsement, and some Idaho Democrats are opposing Governor Hawley, of that state.

Unless Democrats of these three states get together, it is said by men who are supposed to know, that there will be little chance that this appointment will go to any Democrat in those states.

Senator Chamberlain, of Oregon, will have a conference by appointment with Governor Wilson Monday and says if questioned he will give his full and unbiased opinion as to the qualifications of both Mr. Teal and Mr. King. He gave his endorsement to Mr. Teal before Mr. King entered the race.

SCANDAL STIRS VILLAGE

Two Accused Business Men Commit Suicide; Several Arrested.

MYSTIC, Conn., Dec. 28.—The arrest of several business men in this village on charges involving moral turpitude has aroused the entire community. Two men committed suicide rather than face court proceedings. Five of the men arrested are more than 50 years old.

When the officers went to arrest Herman Haulisch, a storekeeper, he asked permission to feed his horse in the barn. While there he dived out of an upper window and broke his neck. Another man, Edward Williams, aged 78, for whom Prosecutor Hewitt said he had a warrant, was found hanging in his dining-room today.

All the arrested men in court today gave heavy bonds for trial in the superior court. More arrests are expected both here and in Groton.
