PENNIES MAY PAY FINES

People Start Popular Subscription for Boise Editors.

BOISE, Idaho, Jan. 4.—One million people will be asked to give 1 cent each to pay the \$500 fines imposed yesterday upon R. S. Sheridan and C. O. Broxon, publisher and managing editor of the Capital-News, who, in addition to their fines, are serving 10-day sentences for contempt in the county jail. The movement was started by Representative Dow Dunn, of Owyhee County, who contributed the first penny and expressed the hope that there were 1,000,000 men and women in the United States who would follow his example and make penny contributions "for the cause of freedom."

Sheridan and Broxon, together with A. R. Craxon, were found guilty of publishing the criticism of Colonel Roosevelt of the Idaho Supreme Court's decision preventing the placing of the Progressive Presidential electors' names on the ballot.

PIONEER OF 1846 IS DEAD

William Turnidge Dies at Gates, Or., at Age of 71.

MILL CITY, Or., Jan. 4.—(Special.)—William Turnidge, who died here December 27, was born in Holt County, Missouri, June 26, 1841. In 1846 he was brought across the plains by his father, Rev. Joseph Turnidge, and they

settled in Linn County, after exciting encounters with Indians.

The first Oregon home was a donation claim on the Santiam, near Selma. Mr. Turnidge moved to King's Prairie, near Gates, in 1872. He is survived by one son, Joseph Turnidge, of Sheridan, and two daughters, Mrs. Jane Gordon, of Pendleton, and Mrs. T. Hennessy, of Gates, with the latter of whom he made his home in late years.

FRANCHISES TO COME UP

Proposed Grants for Railways Will Be Acted on Wednesday.

Franchises will be a most important feature of the regular session of the City Council, to be held next Wednesday morning. Proposed grants for the Harriman and Hill lines will be up for final passage, and those for the Portland

and Railway, Light & Power Company will be subject to consideration as to valuation and advertising in the official paper.

All of the franchises have been pending a long time. It is believed that they will be favorably passed upon this Council session. The Executive Board has fixed a valuation of \$200 a mile for the streetcar franchises. The Council probably will adopt this rate.
