Tennesseean Declares Persons Who Mislead President Are Ones Who Should Suffer.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 11 .- "When mer privately, under the guise of friendship, mislead the King or President, in order to obtain an end other than public welfare, they ought to hang," Representative Sims, of Tennessee, declared in the House today upon the conclusion of the reading of an editorial regarding the Cabinet to be selected by Presidentelect Wilson.

Mr. Sims obtained the floor during the consideration of the Postoffice ap-propriation bill and sent to the desk in editorial lauding the President-elect for the stand taken in this matter.

"Under the English law they did not punish the King for any wrong, but they punished his advisers," Represen-tative Sims added. He said when he

tative Sims added. He said when he read this in his boyhood days he thought it a great outrage, but since then he had concluded it was wise, Mr. Sims continued:

"These who got next to the King and next to the President, who are entrusted with his confidence and who, instead of telling him the plain truth as they see, it, color it so that he does not see the facts, but views them through colored glasses and therefore does wrong

see it, color it so that he does not see the facts, but views them through colored glasses and therefore does wrong through misinformation, I am in favor of hanging, instead of punishing the President.

"In the last hundred years good Presidents have done that which they would not have done if they had known the facts. When a man is appointed to be a Cabinet officer he ought to be a man of ability, ought to forget himself, forget his friends and his enemies and tell the President the plain truth." Representative Sims declared the country had confidence in Governor Wilson's judgment to do the right thing. During his speech on the Cabinet subject Representative Cannon if he had in mind any one who would flit the bill. Mr. Sims replied in the negative.
