POSTOFFICE FRONTCommittee Visits Site for
Building and Decision Is
Made on Ground.

MESSAGE SENT MR. BOURNE

Two Similar Entrances Suggested
but Final Verdict Almost Unani-
mous for Main Entry on
Principal Thoroughfare.

Portland's new \$1,000,000 Postoffice building will front Broadway, Portland's longest and widest street, if a night letter sent last night to ex-Senator Jonathan Bourne, Jr., by H. D. Ramsdell, secretary of the Commercial Club, prevails with the Postoffice Department. The message was framed yesterday following a conference of city and Government officials, business men and representatives of the newspapers, the Greater Portland Piano Association and the Commercial Club, and expressed almost the unanimous opinion of the conference. It was in reply to a telegram received from Mr. Bourne saying that the supervising architect who has charge of the plans for the new building had received what he considered wrong advice from the acting custodian of Portland postal properties as to where the main entrance to the building should be located.

The boundaries of the block on which the new Postoffice will be built are Broadway, Hoyt, Clinton and Park streets, and in the record with the Bennett plans as approved by the people last November, Acting Postmaster Williamson and Acting Custodian Hutchinson recommended that the main entrance be on Park street. Ex-Senator Bourne asked that a conference be called to decide the matter.

The night letter read as follows: Both E. B. Piper and C. S. Jackson, president and vice-president of the Commercial Club, are out of the city. We had in conference C. A. Morden, of the Oregonian; A. L. Fisher, of the Journal; J. F. Correll, of the Telegram; T. E. Marren, of the News; Mayor Rushlight, W. G. Shellenbarger, representing Acting Postmaster Williamson, who is in; J. H. Hutchinson, of the Commercial Club; and J. D. Ramsdell, secretary of the Greater Portland Piano Association; Ed Lyons, of the Northern Pacific Terminal Company, and John Annand and H. D. Ramsdell, of the Commercial Club. J. H. Hutchinson held out for main entrance on Park street, but conceded that recent improvements on Broadway have altered the situation and that the main entrance should be on Broadway and Park street, with fronts alike. All others unanimous for main entrance on Broadway. The name of South street has recently been changed to Broadway.

Site Is Inspected.
The members of the conference went to the site of the proposed building, and the question was argued on the ground and a vote taken, resulting in the verdict for Broadway. Others who took part in the conference were: T. W. Hutchinson, acting custodian; E. L. Thompson, Dr. Andrew C. Smith and Ralph W. Hoyt. Mr. Thompson suggested that the building have entrances on Broadway and Park street, with fronts alike, and that the building be built on Broadway, through the building, corridor running as being decidedly in favor of having the main entrance on Broadway, for the reason that with the opening of the new bridge that street will become a main artery of traffic, and this view was concurred in by others.

STEP - CHILDREN CITIZENS

Ruling Is If Stepmother Is Natural-
ized, Minors Get Rights.

WASHINGTON, April 12.—The naturalization of a stepmother bestows American citizenship on his minor stepchildren, according to a decision today by the Supreme Court. The ruling was made in a case involving the status of two enlisted men of the navy. Alois Betmarik and Charles I. Berry, gunner's mates, stationed at Fort L. I., were brought to this country in their infancy. Their fathers died and their mothers remarried. The stepfather in each case was naturalized during the minority of the children. The court ruled that the children, being the children of a naturalized citizen, were entitled to citizenship. The court also ruled that the children were entitled to the same rights as the children of a naturalized citizen.

SUFFRAGE ISSUE IN CANADA

Calgary Legislative Candidate Advo-
cates Votes for Women.

CALGARY, Alberta, April 12.—(Special.)—Alberta may be the first province in Canada to give women the ballot. The woman's suffrage question has become a live issue in Calgary through the fact that George H. Rose, one of the candidates for the Legislature, is appealing to the people largely on the platform of votes for women. Mr. Rose is an Alderman and a lawyer with advanced views. In every speech Rose advocates extension of the vote.

POLK FAIR UNDER WAY

RULES AND REGULATIONS SENT
TO CHILDREN.Fifth Annual Industrial Exhibit May
Exceed All Others—All Under
21 May Enter.

BUEÑA VISTA, Or., April 12.—(Special.)—Rules and regulations governing the Fifth Annual School Children's Industrial Fair of Polk County for 1913 have been sent out to all the pupils throughout the county. There has been no decision regarding the date of the fair, but preparations are being made earlier than ever before this year.

A tract of land has been secured in Dallas for fair purposes and the necessary funds for the financing of the project are available.

The requirements of the fair, following: Entries close at noon the first day of the fair; each child must do all the work in preparing the article exhibited. In gardening the ground may be prepared by someone else, if desired. In the other work the parent or someone else may instruct the child how to do the work, but the child must be the one that does the work. Every boy or girl in Polk county, under 21 years of age, is eligible to enter the contest, which will be divided into three classes: Class A will include all over 12 years of age, unless having completed the eighth grade. Class B will include all under 12 years of age, while Class C will include all who have completed the eighth grade. Classes A and C in many cases will be combined.

Exhibitors upon application and the blanks must be sent with the article in order to have the same entered. A season ticket for the fair will be given to each child making an exhibit.
