

RAIN STARTS SALES

Fine Growing Weather in Spring Wheat Belt.

CHICAGO MARKET BREAKS

Losses at Close Range Up to Two Cents—Cables Are Lower and Export Demand Is Lacking.

CHICAGO, July 12.—Wheat prices fell to a lower level today for July and September than has been reached at any time this season. Excellent rains

Advances in this season's Spring crop had much to do with making the market weak. The close, which was nearly at the bottom point reached, showed a net loss of 1½¢ to 1¼¢ to 1½¢ to 2¢. Corn finished ½¢ to ¾¢ down, oats off ½¢ to ¾¢ and provisions varying from 10¢ decline to a like advance.

Chicago, Oct. 10.—Wheat by longs bore down the market from the outset. Cables were lower and there seemed to be no evidence of export demand.

Primary receipts for 24 hours amounted to 1,289,000 bushels, against 622,000 bushels a year ago. Seaboard clearances of wheat and flour today

quailed by 123,000 bushels.

Sentiment in the corn crowd became rampantly bullish as a result of the continued fine weather and the improved outlook for the growing crop. Oats broke with other grain.

Action in the provision pit had a saw-saw character. The reason was that the hog market, conditioned with sympathy for the weakening of the cereals.
